PROCEEDINGS OF THEPUBLIC HEARING OF A PROJECT PROPOSED BY M/S. ARYAN ISPAT & POWER PVT LIMITED FOR ESTABLISHMENT OF 5.0 MTPA CAPACITY COAL WASHERY AT-BOMALOI, RENGALI TAHASIL OF SAMBALPUR DISTRCT HELD ON 12.01.2021 AT: 10.00 A.M. AT: BOMALOI GRAM PANCHAYAT OFFICE PREMISES, RENGALI TAHAHSIL OF SAMBALPUR DISTRICT.

Sri Umakanta Raj, OAS (S), Additional District Magistrate(Revenue), Sambalpur presided over the meeting along with Er. Ramesh Kumar Ekka, Regional Officer, State Pollution Control Board, Odisha, Sambalpur.

At the outset, Er. Ramesh Kumar Ekka, Regional Officer, State Pollution Control Board, Sambalpur welcomed all the public present in the meeting. He briefly described the objective of the public hearing conducted as per the provisions of EIA Notification No. S.O. 1533(E) of Dt.14<sup>th</sup> September 2006 of the Ministry of Environment and Forests & Climate Change (MOEF & CC), Government of India. He also informed that the date, time and venue for conducting the public hearing meeting of the project proposed by M/s. Aryan Ispat & Power Pvt. At-Bomaloi, RengaliTahasil of Sambalpur establishment of 5.0 MTPA capacity Coal Washery on 12.01.2021 At:10.00A.M.At: Bomaloi Gram Panchavat Office RengaliTahasil of Sambalpur district was duly advertised in Odia daily "The Samaja", dtd.08.12.2020 and English daily "The Times of India" dtd.08.12.2020(Paper clipping are enclosed as Annexure-I).

The Addl. District Magistrate (Revenue), Sambalpur has also briefed about the proposed project and requested the public who were present during the public hearing meeting to express their opinions and views on the proposed project. He also requested the representative of the proposed project to highlight about their proposed project before the public.

On behalf of the project proponent, Sri Pabitra Kumar Behera, Project GM, M/s. Aryan Ispat& Power Pvt. Limited, Bomaloi, addressed the public during the public hearing meeting. He briefly explained about the project and assured the public that the company will adopt latest technology to prevent any pollution and implement good CSR practices for the welfare of the local area. He informed that the proposed establishment of 5.0 MTPA Coal Washery at Bomaloi, Tehsil: Rengali, Dist: Sambalpur is the market requirement for Coal and washed coal, therefore, the industry has proposed for establishment of 5.0 MTPA coal washeryplant. He further stated that the major availability of coal during the XII Plan is expected from the Karanpura, Korba, Mand- Raigarh& IB Vally coal fields, AIPPL proposal for Bomaloi

washery by 5 MTPA is justified. The coal will also be procured from MCL. The proposed project of Rs. 60 Crores will provide direct employment to a large number of personnel. This project will also generate indirect employment to a considerable number of families which will render their services for the employees of the project. Around 200 nos. will be engaged at the time of construction and 70 nos. will be required after completion of the project. The work will go on for 3 shifts.VIMTA LAB, Hydrabadhas conducted the Environmental Impact Assessment for the Proposed 5.0 MTPA Coal washery.

The Addl. District Magistrate (Revenue), Sambalpur invited the public to offer their views on environmental related issues of the proposed project.

About 250-300 participants have attended the public hearing meeting and out of them 65 participants have put their signature in the attendance sheet whose list is annexed as **Annexure-II**. 24 persons have registered their name to deliver their views during public hearing and list is annexed as **Annexure-III**.

Statements of the public participated in the deliberation during public hearing meeting is as follow;



### 20. **Sri Bhakti Kisan, Bomaloi:**

- He informed that the industry has been established since last 15 years and it is the first plant in that area.
- He stated that, the industry has taken all the lands from the local people at less price like vegetable price and had assured the local people to providean employment but till date no employment has been provided to the local people.
- He alleged against the M/s. Aditya Aluminiumand said that the company has taken his land and had assured to give employment but failed to provided yet.
- He further added that, Government had also assured to providean employment to the local people but, failed to do so.
- He expressed his dissatisfaction and stated that, if such industries do not provide an employment to local people, then how the local people will get livelihood.
- Finally, heurged before the company authority to provide an employment to the local people, else he will oppose the proposed project.

# 21. Sri Ramesh Chandra Barik, Dhhoropani:

- He expressed his supports over the project and also made an allegation about the industry for not fulfilling their commitment made during public hearing.
- Therefore, he urged before the district administration to make antri-agreement between local people, company authority and district administration to finalize the local employment issues before going for expansion project.

#### 22. **Sri Seshadev Pradhan, Tileimal:**

- He infromed that M/s. Bhushan Steel & Power Limited is the first company in their locality then comes M/s. Aditya Aluminium and M/s. Aryan Ispat& Power Projects Ltd. Due to this project, the local people have developed. However, still there are some problems.
- He said that, the Phulchanger village is located in between M/s. Aditya Aluminium and M/s. Aryan Ispat& Power Projects Ltd. Hence the total land of the village should be taken and the villagers should be relocated at some other place having suitable environment to live.
- He also pointed out the water scarcity in Phulchanger village due to industrialization.
- Finally, he stated that some villagers are employed by the industry and he further demanded before the company authority to provide an employment to the unemployedlocal villagers and peripheral developmental work.

# 23. **Sri Sudhir Kumar Gupta, Lapanga:**

- He expressed his dissatisfaction towards an industry for not providing an employment to the local people.
- Therefore, he demanded before the company authority to provide an employment to the local villagers and peripheral developmental work.
- Finally, he requested the State Pollution Control Board representatives to visit the peripheral villages in order to check the environmental pollution.

# 24. **Sri Lingaraj Behera, Phulchanger:**

He expressed his dissatisfaction towards the company authority and made the following allegation against the company authority;

- The industry has not done anything for the local people till date and there is no contribution of the industry during the pandemic Covid 19 in the local area.
- The industry has neither provided mask nor sanitiser to the local villagers during the pandemic Covid 19. The industry has paid half of the salary during covid 19 to the villagers who are employed in the industry.
- The industry has not provided any health care facilities till date for the local people.
- The industry has not provided any school for the local villagers.
- The industry has not provided any garden for the children in the local area.
- He further alleged that during the period of Sri K.P. Shukla, former President of the industryno local people were provided an employment.

Therefore, he urged before the district administration to make an tri-agreement between local people, company authority and district administration to provide the hospital, public school, garden and youth employment before establishment of the industry.

Summary of the points raised by the participants in the public hearing are being read out by the Regional Officer, State Pollution Control Board, Sambalpur and same in English and Odiya(vernacular language) is enclosed as **Annexure-IV** (A & B).

After the completion of the deliberation process the Addl. District Magistrate (Revenue), Sambalpur invited the representatives of M/s. Aryan Ispat& Power Pvt. Limited to give a brief note on the issues related to the demand and grievances of the participants raised in the public
