FOR GRANT OF ENVIRONMENTAL CLEARANCE FOR CHHUINPALI SAND QUARRY FOR PRODUCTION OF 13,659 CUM/ANNUM OF SAND OVER MINE LEASE AREA OF 5.90 HA. ON RIVER KELO, AT CHHUINPALI VILLAGE, TEHSIL LAKHANPUR OF JHARSUGUDA DISTRICT, HELD AT CHHUINPALI VILLAGE, TEHSIL LAKHANPUR OF JHARSUGUDA DISTRICT ON 31.08.2021 AT 11.30 AM.

The public hearing of M/s. Shree Balaji Engicons Pvt. Ltd. for grant of Environmental Clearance for Chhuinpali Sand Quarry for production of 13,659 cum/annum of sand over mine lease area of 5.90 ha. on river Kelo, at Chhuinpali village, tehsil Lakhanpur of Jharsuguda district was conducted on 31.08.2021 at 11.30 am at Chhuinpali Village, tehsil Lakhanpur in the district of Jharsuguda. During the course of Public Hearing the instructions of Govt. of India communicated vide Office Memorandum F.No. 22-25/2020-IA.III dtd. 14.09.2020 of Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change (MoEF&CC) of Govt. of India regarding Covid-19 Pandemic Restrictions and also the guidelines for Covid-19 of Govt. of Odisha has been duly followed.

Shri Lankeswar Amat, Additional District Magistrate, Jharsuguda supervised and presided over the Public Hearing Process, assisted by Sri Hiranya Kumar Nayak, Regional Officer, State Pollution Control Board, Jharsuguda & representative of State Pollution Control Board, Odisha. The State Pollution Control Board, Odisha, Bhubaneswar had advertised in newspaper in Odia daily – Prameya on 28.07.2021 and in English daily-The New Indian Express on 28.07.2021. The Public Hearing in respect of the above project stated as per the schedule and the venue decided by the District Magistrate in accordance with the EIA Notification S.O.1533(E), dated 14.09.2006. The attendance sheet of the panel members present in the public hearing is annexed as **Annexure – I**. Around 90 persons had attended the public hearing meeting whereas 53 persons had signed the attendance sheet. The attendance sheet of the public participants attended the public hearing is annexed as **Annexure-II**. In response of the Covid-19 pandemic restrictions & precautions, sitting arrangement at meeting place with social distancing was made up to 100 and waiting facility followed by social distancing adjacent to the venue were provided to accommodate more numbers of public.

At the outset, Sri Hiranya Kumar Nayak, Regional Officer, SPCB welcomed the panel member and the public presented in the meeting. He briefly described the objectives and procedure followed for conducting the Public Hearing as per the EIA Notification S.O.1533(E),

dated 14.09.2006 of Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change (MoEF&CC), Govt. of India. He requested Additional District Magistrate, Jharsuguda to preside over the meeting.

Welcoming the panel members and the assembled public in the meeting, Shri Lankeswar Amat, ADM, Jharsuguda, explained the objective of the proposed Chhuinpali Sand Quarry project and invited the public to present their views about the proposed project. He also requested the public to maintain peace & discipline for completion of the meeting. He asked the Project Proponent to make a brief presentation before the public gathered in the meeting about the proposed Chhuinpali Sand Quarry.

On behalf of the Project Proponent, Sri Ashok Kumar Mahakud of Chhuinpali Sand Quarry welcomed the public and all other participants. He said that Project Proponent have applied to the Government for the permission of Government for the proposed sand quarry and the meeting was conducted for the processing of the application for Environmental Clearance for the views of Public. He invited the representative of Consultancy Kalyani Laboratory to give a brief description about the proposed sand quarry for the public. Sri Jagabandhu Bisoi, presented the brief of proposed Chhuinpali Sand Quarry in Odia language which are as follows:

- As per Ministry of environment forest & Climate Change, Govt. of India, EIA notification (2006) and subsequent amendments, Environmental Clearance is a mandatory requirement for the proposed Chhuinpali Sand Quarry project of M/s. Shree Balaji Engicons Pvt. Ltd. for production of 13,659 cum/annum of sand over mine lease area of 5.90 ha on river Kelo at Chhuinpali village, tehsil Lakhanpur in the district of Jharsuguda and public hearing is a part of the process.
- Mining plan of Chhuinpali Sand Quarry has been approved by Dy. Director of Geology, Sambalpur on dt. 17.05.2018. Tahasildar, Lakhanpur has given the lease of sand quarry to M/s. Shree Balaji Engicons Pvt. Ltd for five years. Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) & Environmental Management Plan (EMP) of Chuinpali river sand bed is prepared in accordance with the requirements of EC as per Ministry of Environment Forest & Climate Change, Govt. of India, EIA notification (2006) and subsequent amendments.
- The EIA / EMP report for the mines has been prepared by Kalyani Laboratories Private Limited, Bhubaneswar based on the base line study carried out during October to December 2020.
- The project site of Chuinpalli sand Quarry is located about 20km away from the Belphar of Jharsuguda and 20 km away from the nearest Raigarh Railway Station.

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mining operations, transportation of mined material to different destinations. Approach road will be made to connect the sand mining area to main road so that land and environment will be under control. To arrest land degradation, Seedling will be planted for green belt development. Direct & Indirect employment will be generated after the execution of the proposed project. Development of communication facilities, office building, drinking water supply, rest shelter and Primary Health Center will be carried out after commencement of sand mining.

- Daily living standard of the people along with social & economic rate will be improved due to the sand mining project.
- The health of employed persons will be checked regularly and necessary health service facilities will be provided.
- Dust mask and Ear plugs will be provided to the employed persons as occupational health safety measures
- Training will be given to the employed persons regarding safety measures and primary health facilities will also be provided to them.
- The project proponent is committed to bear the expenses related to health issues of the employed persons.
- The proposed project cost is about 10 lakhs and as the amendment of EIA notification on 30.09.2020, the project proponent will bear all the expenses related to the peripheral development and environmental issues raised by the public in the public hearing. Besides these expenses, the lessee has planned to do following expenses for local development.

Local Health Camp: Rs 50,000/-

Village primary school: Rs 100000/-

Maintenance of tube-wells & drinking water facilities: Rs50,000/-

Rain water Harvesting in the village school: Rs50,000/-

Plantation Activities in the area: Rs50,000/-

Total Rs 3,00,000/- expenses is planned towards the local development.

- A village committee will be formulated for successful implementation of Environment Management Plan and peripheral developments. The committee will ensure the implementation of Environment Management Plan and peripheral developments by thorough reviews.

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
The lease area is located in survey of India toposheet no 64O/9 from geographical point of view. At present, there is enough demand of sand. The project intend to excavate of maximum up to 13656 cum/ annum of sand from the lease area.

- As per the land use pattern within 10 km of the study area of the proposed project area, it has been observed that about 3% of the land use covered under fallow land, 17% under water bodies, 43% covered under lake, 11% covered under forest land, 1% Mine area, 21% scrub land, 1% crop land and 6% covered under other land.
- Sand mining will be carried out in open cast manual method. As it is flood affected area, the area cannot be used for other purpose except sand mining. Generation of direct employment in the proposed sand mining operation will be 12 persons. About 12 nos. of skilled, semi-skilled and unskilled persons will be directly employed and 50 nos. of persons will be benefited through indirect employment. Green belt development and plantation of fruit, other economic & different types of medicinal trees like Jammu, Chakunda, Ganga Siuli, Karanja, Arujuna etc. will be carried out in the river bank and in the nearby vacant spaces in the 5 years of the project period. In the first year, a target of plantation of 500 nos. of seedlings has been fixed.
- Manual method of mining and transportation of sand to various destinations is planned. Air, Water, Soil and Noise samples were collected from the different places within Study area of 10 km radius of the proposed sand mining and the samples were examined as per the prescribed methods of Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB). The result of analysis is within the prescribed limits of the standard of CPCB. The details of the analysis are available in EIA & EMP reports.
- As per Environment Management Plan, regular water sprinkling will be carried out in the sand mining and approach roads. Air & noise pollution will be minimised by checking process regarding the fumes & noise level of the vehicles. The ultimate depth of mining is 1.5 m below water level and there will be no adverse impact on the water level.
- Mining activities and its related activities will impact the surface features of the land. There is no land degradation due to mining activities as mining is done only on river bed dry surface and unfit for cultivation. The impact of the river bed sand mines on the land environment is due to creation of access roads,

Atul Kumar Singh, Lankarwar Area

Then Sri Lankeswar Amat, Additional District Magistrate, Jharsuguda, invited the public to present their views about the proposed sand mining in peaceful manner. Then the public deliberated on various issues one by one. During the public hearing, all have been given an opportunity to express their views freely on the proposed project. About 26 persons had delivered their views and the attendance sheet of the public participants who delivered their views is annexed as **Annexure – III**. The statement of public participated in the deliberation is annexed as **Annexure IV**. After the deliberations were made by the public. Regional Officer, State Pollution Control Board, Jharsuguda invited the project proponent to offer the views and commitments on the issues raised by the public. The summary of the views and opinions of the public and the commitments made by the project proponent are annexed in English and Odia language as **Annexure V&VI** respectively.

About 46 numbers of written representations were received which are annexed as **Annexure VII**. The video recording of the entire proceedings of the public hearing are enclosed herewith and will be forwarded to the State Environment Impact Assessment Authority (SEIAA), Odisha, Bhubaneswar as such along with the written statements of the public & proceedings of the meeting. Finally the meeting ended with vote of thanks to the chair, public and other participants.

The statement of the public participated in the deliberation during the public hearing for the proposed project of M/s. Shree Balaji Engicons Pvt. Ltd. for grant of Environmental Clearance for Chhuinpali Sand Quarry for production of sand of quantity of 13,659 cum/Annum over Mine Lease area of 5.90 ha. on river Kelo held at Chhuinpali village, tehsil Lakhanpur of Jharsuguda district on 31.08.2021 at 11.30 am.

The views expressed by various speakers present in the meeting are as follows:

1. Dilip Kumar Patel, Jampali Village

He stated that no work could be done without negative positive aspects. Nobody has come to the meeting with opposing or supportive mentality rather all have come to place their own views. He expressed his own views on Kelo sand bed that about 80% of profit may be come out with 20% loss with establishment of any industry. But in his view 100% good things would come up with the proposed sand bed. No pollution will be caused to the atmosphere. The proposed measures for the sand bed mining is good. He also emphasized that removal of deposition of sand from Kelo river will increase the water holding capacity. Theft of sand could not be made and Government will get Royalty & Cess. Development of village, Gram Panchayat, Block and State will be made with royalty money. He also said that they could not live without sand and they can get the Sand easily by paying the royalty. Lastly he said that sand mining is not harmful.

2. Tribikram Pujari, Pujaripali, Bhikampali, G.P

He said that it is a matter of happiness. It is very difficult to get sand and if sand bed mining commences, we can buy the sand with paying the appropriate cost & royalty will be paid to the Government. Now they are paying more cost for transportation and are going for the sand up to Gandhi chowk. He requested the Collector to allow for the sand mining. He also stated that Balaji Engicon had been supporting & helping for their various institutional work in the area. At last, he welcomed the proposed project by making slogan "BALIGHAT".

3. Sri Aswini Pujari, Pujaripali

He welcomed the panel members and strongly supported the proposed sand mining. He said that he agreed with views of previous speakers that no harm will be made by the sand mining. At present, there was no Govt. approved sand quarry and sand has been theft with loss of royalty. Sand has been transported from Raigarh. He said that sand deposition in the River has been increased. So sand mining will increase the water holding capacity.

Dilip Kumar Patel, Jampali Village

Employment will be made and tractors will be engaged for the transportation activities. Ancillary CSR activities will be made in this area. With this he expressed that no harm will be made with the sand mining rather benefits will be made. He again said that he strongly supports the project and requested the Government to grant Environmental Clearance to this Project.

4. Nirajan Pradhan, Bhikampali Gram Panchyat

He told that he strongly supported the project and there was no Govt. approved sand mine. There will be development over the area due to the proposed sand mining. Balaji Engicon has given employment of about at least 200 persons in other works of the area and will give more employment in the sand mining. He requested the ADM and Govt. to approve the sand mining.

5. Dwitiya Bhoi, Panchgaon village

He welcomed the panel members, officials and public present in the meeting. He expressed his strong condemnation for the project proponent. He said that sand will be transported to different destinations and local people will not get sand for construction of Biju Pakka Ghar/ Pradhanmantri awas Yojana. Land, water & air of this area will pollute completely due to sand mining. The road infrastructure of this area will collapse due to mining. Finally, he demanded to stop the auction process of sand mining.

6. Ramlal Meher, Bhikampalli village

He thanked the Government for the sand mining in Kelo River at Chhuinpali and said that it was a matter of happiness for this area and thanked the project proponent. There was no difficulties in the sand mining and previously the river bed was deep and it will be good with the lifting of sand from Kelo River Bed. Due to corona, there was no employment, so employment will be generated for the 100-200 local people. At last, he requested the ADM for sand mining and focus on development of the area.

7. Nityananda Pradhan, Bhikampali village

He supported the project and agreed with the views of previous speakers.

8. Jiten Seth, Machida Sarpanch

He welcomed the panel members and public and said that there was no rainfall in this area since the Balaji Company has started work in this area. There will be no pollution due to

the lifting of the sand, but the velocity of the water flow will be increased in the River as well as in the connected tributaries resulting damage of the crop and will affect the environment. Air pollution will be caused due to the fumes of the vehicles and road dust during transportation of dust. Hence, we should not support the sand mining. If we play game with environment, environment will play game with us. Lastly, he requested to stop the sand mining.

9. Sri Sundarlal Seth, Samiti Member, Chikilipali Village

He stated that River will be widened with lifting of the sand and forest will be damaged. So sand mining should be stopped. He also said that notice was to be given before 8-10 days, but it was given before 2-3 days and he opposed the project.

10. Krushna Kalo Sarpanch, Bhikampali

He welcomed the chair & public and said that Bajaji Engicon Company had lifted sand before 2-3 years and showed them the trailer. He raised a issue that project proponent will engage 12 persons for sand lifting but previously Sand was lifted by excavators & tippers rather than labours and tractors. It had caused pollution. Finally he said that he did not agree with sand mining by Bajaji Engicons and opposed the project.

11. Bhushab Bag, Kapilapur, Bhikampali

He said that Sand mining was to be closed and avenue plantation along roads of the village was not carried out. No development work has been carried out.

12. Bipin Didan, Kapilapur, Kapilapur, Bhikampali

He welcomed the project conditionally and said that employment should be given on eligibility basis. But Balaji Company had not given employment to the local people rather work had been carried out by outside people. If it is to be done in proper manner then it is welcomed.

13. Naresh Khamari, Nachunmura, BJD President

He strongly opposed the proposed sand mining. He told that Bajaji company did not engage labour but it engaged machines. It was stealing the sand. Without permission it has made sand stocks. It had not any CSR activities and planation. It had not done water sprinkling, so air pollution was there. It has been doing smuggling of hundred trips of sand. It has dug a drain on other side of the village without getting permission. . No CSR activity has been done in so many years. Lastly, he opposed the project.

He is a person who is doing work in the name of the company. Lankeswar Jant

14. Sanjay Kumar Bhoi, Machida village, BJP Vice President

He opposed the project and demanded to give lease on small scale basis to the local people to lift it through tractors and labourers for their livelihood. Lease may be given to the Balaji Company on IB and Mahanadi river. Bajaji company will lift sand through tippers and 10 wheelers and will surely do smuggling of sand. He raised the issue of road dust pollution and said that no plantation activity has been carried out by the Balaji Company. He again demanded that lease shall not be given to the Bajai Company and strongly opposed the project.

15. Muralidhar Meher, Chhuinpali village

He told that Chhuinpali is a small village and does not have enough resources of money & public force. He welcomed the project and demanded that developmental facilities should be made in the village and village should be made free from pollution.

16. Manas Rajan Behera, Sagarpali, (BJD, Social Media Incharge)

He welcomed the panel members, officials & public and said that Vedanta, Bhushan and other companies did not think about environment. TRL company had cut down many trees. Like East India Company, Balaji Comapany will do the same thing in this area. So he strongly opposed the proposed sand mining.

17. Omprakash Mishra, Bhikampali village

He opposed the project and said that damages will happen to this area with the up coming project. Conspiracy has been made and the public hearing has been conducted illegally.

18. Rajesh Deheri, Pujaripali Village

He told that there are three mines of TRL,OCL and Balaji operating in the area. Due to Blasting effect in mines, houses were getting damaged. He requested that house should not be get damaged.

19. Jadumani Sripuria, Pujaripali village

He raised the earlier issues of Balaji Company regarding daily wage payment and said that they are dependent on forest, river & hills for their livelihood. Now they are lifting sand along with family members for construction of their house. There will be no employment as sand lifting will be done through heavy vehicles. If lease will be given to the Balaji company then they would not touch the sand as well as the water.

Sanjay Kumar Bhoi, Machida

20. Debadatta Nath, Chikilapali Village

He strongly condemned the sand mining and said that the company will lift sand by 200 machine & heavy vehicles and there will be no employment to the local people. He opposed the project

21. Jibardhan Majhi, Pujaripali

He said that it ate the forest, now will eat the sand, will poison the faith and will kill every one. He opposed the project.

22. Paritosh Mishra Kapilapur

He stated that public hearing management was not good. He thanked the Kalyan Laboratories for his work. He said that lease has already been given to the Balaji Engicons.

23. Khushiram Pradhan, Rengali, Panchgaon

He said that previously it has lifted 200 trips of sand through trucks, hywas and trailers. Already the lease has been given and sand has been lifted and why permission is required now.

24. Gobardhan Nath Chikilapali

He welcomed the panel members & public and said that both good & impacts of the sand mining should be considered for getting the result. He also said that as per MMDR Act 1957, Section 21(5) each mines/quarry, sand quarry is coming under minor mineral. There are categories of the minerals like minor mineral, major mineral and specified minerals. He said that he was M.A in English and an Intellectual. Everyone should be clear for getting result of Public Hearing. It is good for lifting of the mineral subject to implementation of laws and checking by Government, Lease holder and local people. Now Surveillance has been made by the Government for sand trucks for the mine and destination and it was not age of sand smuggling. Pollution has no boundary and the industries like NTPC, Bhushan have been polluting the environment. A small stone quarry and sand quarry will not pollute the environment. As the sand is in water, there is no chances of dust generation, hence no pollution. If anybody has doubt, then he will approach the Govt. Official for whether the mineral has been extracted in right manner or not. TRL, OCL and Balaji is paying Royalty and DMF. The money belongs to them and expenses has been made for them for the developmental project like Bridge. Lastly, he requested the public not to oppose the project and expressed his opinion that it is good to do sand mining project in legal way.



25. Gajanan Patel, Chikilapali, Bhikampali

He said that number of outside persons is 50% of the total employed persons. It is making violation of sand lifting by 12 nos. of local people and sand will be lifted by engaging machine & heavy vehicles by roads. Now the local people is paying Rs. 620/- of royalty per trip of tractor. There are 35 nos. of tractors in the locality. If lease will be given to the Balaji, then the company will not give sand to the local people. So he intensely opposed the project

26. Kishore Singh, Dhurwa, Pujaripali

He raised the displacement issues of Hirakud dam for Pujaripali & Chhuinipali villages. He said that Government is getting royalty of three nos. of mines, but their houses were getting damaged due to blasting activities. Earlier, there were about 2500 nos. of cattle but now the nos. of cattle have been drastically reduced due to blasting. Sand quarry and mine should be stopped and Chelia Pahad should be made free. There will be dust pollution if thousands of trucks will move. He also said that his own mother has suffered from kidney disease due to pollution of blasting. If lease will be given to Balaji, then they will beg hand for a trip of sand for their requirement. He also told that it was their sand but they will not get it. Government should take the sand & forest. He opposed the project and demanded to make free the Chelia Pahad.
