

Proceeding of the public hearing conducted for installation of 14 (2×7) MTPA capacity green field pellet plant of Essar Minmet Limited at Paradeep in Jagatsinghpur District held on Dtd. 05.01.2022 at 11.00 AM at Kalyan Mandap, Paradeep in Jagatsinghpur District.

A public hearing was conducted on 05.01.2022 at 11.00 AM at the vacant space in front of Municipality Kalyan Mandap, Paradip of Jagatsinghpur district for installation of 14 (2×7) MTPA capacity green field pellet plant of Essar Minmet Limited at Paradeep in Jagatsinghpur District. Sri Kahnu Charan Dhir, Additional District Magistrate, Paradip presided over the meeting and Er. Dillip Kumar Dash, Regional Officer, State Pollution Control Board, Odisha, Paradip assisted him. He welcomed the public who were present at the venue for participating in the hearing. Attendance sheets of the officials present in the hearing and that of public present inside the venue are annexed as **Annexure I and II** respectively. 100 persons were present in the meeting and have put their signatures in the attendance sheet, out of which 24 persons intended to deliver their views and their list is annexed as **Annexure-III**. Out of those, 23 persons took part in the deliberations and one person did not come for deliberation. 02 written statements were received from during the public hearing. Video recording of the entire proceeding of the public hearing was done and it will be forwarded to the Ministry of Environment & Forest, Govt. of India, New Delhi as such along with this proceeding.

At the outset, Er. Dillip Kumar Dash, Regional Officer, State Pollution Control Board, Paradip welcomed all the public present in the meeting. He briefly described the objective of this project. He explained about the requirement of public hearing in view of the mandatory environmental clearance (EC) from Ministry of Environment and Forests & Climate Change (MOEF & CC), Government of India. The public hearing is conducted as per the provisions of EIA Notification No. S.O. 1533(E) of Dt.14th September 2006 of the MOEF & CC, Government of India. He also explained about the importance of the actual views of local public regarding the project. He also informed that the date, time and venue for conducting this public hearing for Jagatsinghpur district was duly advertised in one Odia daily newspaper, The

Prameya, Dtd. 03.12.2021 and in one English daily newspaper The Times Of India Dtd. 03.12.2021 following due procedure for intimation of public. Further, public notices were displayed at Office of Tahsildar, Kujanga and B.D.O., Kujanga and many public places in Paradip of Jagatsinghpur district. The venue, date and timing of the public hearing meeting of the said project were also propagated through loudspeaker announcement in the area the meeting venue for ready reference of public. EIA report and Executive summary of the proposed project both in Odia & English were displayed at Office of Tahsildar, Kujanga and B.D.O., Kujanga. The executive summary was also made available in the website of State pollution Control Board, Bhubaneswar (www.ospcboard.org).

Addl. District Magistrate, Paradip and Regional Officer requested public to place their views about the environmental impacts of the proposed project and emphasized that their statements should be related to environment and pollution and its control aspects. Then the Regional Officer called the project proponent to describe before the public about the details of the project and its impact on surrounding environment.

Sri Prakash Chandra Mohapatra, Director (Projects) briefed about the importance of pellet plants in connection with complete use of iron ore fines in steel making thus improving mineral resource utilization in the country. He intimated that this proposed pellet plant project will be established over an area of 40.49 Hectars which has been taken in lease from Paradip Port Trust for a period of 60 years. The said land is a vacant land and resettlement-cum-rehabilitation of people will not be required. This plant will be first of its kind in India to cater to the pellet requirement of both Blast furnace (BF) grade and Direct Reduced Iron (DRI) grade and both these products can fulfill the export requirements. The iron ore fines being the prime raw material will be beneficiated in Keonjhar District and will be transported to Paradip through a dedicated slurry pipeline. Unlike many other existing pellet plants in the country, this unit will install a separate waste water return pipe line to Keonjhar so as to utilize the same in beneficiation. Thus, waste water discharge problems to outside land/water bodies will be completely got rid off (Zero liquid discharge). The pellet plants will be designed with the latest technology and particulate matter emission


through stacks beyond electrostatic precipitators (ESPs) will be less than 30mg/Nm³. To control fugitive emissions at various transfer points and junction houses dry fog system will be provided. Further, wind shields of about 10 metres height will be provided around the dust prone area so as to protect outside area from dust pollution. With such latest pollution control equipment and measures over all environmental impact will be minimum. The industry will operate with highest compliance level and will also dedicate towards socio economic development in the surrounding area. It has been estimated that about 750 and 600 people will be employed during constructional and operational phases respectively.


Regional Officer, SPCB, Odisha, Paradip then invited public for their deliberations. Details of deliberations are annexed at **Annexure-IV**.

During the deliberations, some people raised various administrative issues and persisting problems in the industrial area of Paradip. ADM, Paradeep clarified those issues on the spot during the deliberations. After the deliberations by the public was over, Regional Officer, SPCB, Paradip summarized various issues raised by the public and invited the project proponent to offer their views on those issues. Sri Prakash Chandra Mohapatra, Director (Projects) placed his views on the issues raised by the public.

The summary of the views and concerns of the public and the commitments made by the project proponent are annexed in Oriya language & English language as **Annexure-V&VI** respectively.

Finally the meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the chair and other participants.

Statement of the public participated in the deliberation during public hearing conducted for installation of 14 (2×7) MTPA capacity green field pellet plant of Essar Minmet Limited at Paradeep in Jagatsinghpur District held on Dtd. 05.01.2022

1. Amiya Prasad das, Bijaychandrapur

He state that the project will be supported is pollution problems are reduced and employment is provided to local people at all the levels. He suggested for formation of a committee in Paradip involving all the major industrial houses, district administration and eminent personalities of Pardip which will review the status of pollution control in Pardip.

2. Sarat Kumar Rout, Nua Bazar, Pardip

He intimated that the old pellet plant of Essar (Presently operating as AM/NS India Ltd.) has not fulfilled any of its commitments made during its establishment and therefore, it is the least complaint industry in Paradip in terms of plantation (only 12%). Therefore, he opposed the establishment of a new unit by Essar.

3. Deba Kalyan Mohapatra, Adarsh Prayash, Parip

He emphasized about existing pollution problems in Paradip and non fulfillment of commitments made by major industries earlier. He stated that Pardip does not have proper health care facility even though 15 large scale industries are present here. The provisions of Public Liability Insurance (PLI) Act are not being followed properly. With conditions of establishment of proper hospital and following of provisions of PLI Act, this pellet plant project may come.

4. Brundaban Das, Uday Bihar Nagarika Parishad

He highlighted about Bata nadi (rivulet) being the only natural drainage channel covering Rahama, Kujanga, Erasama and other areas of Jagatsinghpur District. He further opined that establishment of so many polluting industries in Paradip region has affected water quality resulting in water borne diseases in the area. He further highlighted that nothing has been mentioned in executive summary about use of coal in the plant and data on air and water pollution. Essar Minmet Limited should look into all the above aspects of pollution.

5. Antaryami Pattnaik, Balidiha, Paradeepgarh

He elaborated about the relation between technological advancement and development and potential of employment of local people in industries. He emphasized about provision of technical training institutes, medical facilities in the area to uplift the livelihood of people. He further urged before the administration saying that local people should not only be employed as unskilled/ semiskilled labourers and drivers, but also should they be employed in officers level after their technical skill enrichment.

6. Akhila Kumar Mallick, Bauriapalanda

He showed his concerns about the living conditions of people in Balijhara and Bauriapalanda Bastis and how their temporary houses are affected due to water logging in monsoon. Though so many industrial houses are operating in the vicinity the conditions are not proving in the basti area and no C.S.R. activities are done by the oil companies. Though students with all educational background are available in Paradip employment is given to outsiders. He suggested about formation of a committee to look into the above problems. Finally, he welcomed the project with a condition of proper rehabilitation of basti people by providing them pucca houses.

7. Bikash Sahu, Youth Federation, Bijaychandrapur

Though he supported the project to come up, he showed his concerns over non-fulfillment of commitments made by so many industries. He intimated that CSR fund is being spent outside the local area; employment is being given to outside people; there are issues like poor education, health and employment infrastructure. He also highlighted that the drinking water reservoir of Paradip port is nearby which needs to be protected.

8. Seshadeba Senapati, Balijhara, Paradip

He highlighted about the poor road condition of the road connecting PPL main gate to national highway which was in turn explained by ADM that the road would be rebuilt soon and budget has been passed. He also emphasized on the existing water logging issues in the basti area. He said that he is neither opposing nor supporting the project; but if the project comes, it should look into these existing problems of the area.

9. Jyotish Dash, Paradeep

He highlighted that the Bauriapalanda basti is worst affected due to the operating oil companies surrounding it and therefore he is opposing the project. However, if the company promises to rehabilitate the same basti, he will render support to it.

10. Ratnakar Jena, Paradip

He described that industries are coming because Odisha is full of mineral and water resources and people should be benefitted with good roads, water supply, hospitals due to industrial development. People are opposing the project only because ESSAR may not give employment to local people. Therefore he suggested for formation of a committee to review these issues. Finally he opined that Paradip Port Trust has taken land from people for port activities and not for selling it to other industrial houses.

11. Shiba Charan Biswal, Paradip Environment Protection Trust, Paradeep

He questioned about the revenue records of the allocated land to ESSAR and intimated that the entire land falls in river category and there were revenue mistakes while the same was handed over to Paradip port. Therefore the land actually does not belong to Paradip port and it cannot be given to ESSAR on lease. He opposed the project.

12. Ayashkant Roy, Paradip Nagarika Mancha

Initially, he rushed into the public hearing site with signals of opposing the project and while speaking, he highlighted that Paradip area depends on paddy, beetle and fish for peoples' livelihood which has been destroyed by the industries and therefore he is opposing the project. However, if ESSAR starts plantation activities immediately and rehabilitates the nearby basti, he would support the project.

13. Pratap Kumar Samal, Paradeep Garh

He highlighted that ESSAR is the only company in Paradip, which has fulfilled its commitments earlier and has given employment to local people and therefore he is supporting the project. He also requested that local contractors should also be engaged in the industries and all industries should give employment to locals as per Government Rules. He demanded that district administration should take up

action for establishment of a superspeciality hospital at Paradeep and a Grave yard at Paradipgarh.

14. Sankarsan Das, Chakradharpur

He supported the project with a condition that all commitments made by the industry should be fulfilled and local basti people should get the benefits.

15. Nirmal Samantray, Pipal

He intimated that all land losers of earlier project of ESSAR have not been benefited. He welcomed the project with conditions that the industry should fulfill its commitments. He also demanded to solve storm water drainage problem of Pipal and Paradeep Garh and good health care facility.

16. Pramod Kumar Jena, Nuagarh G.P.

He highlighted that Paradip is a polluted zone and ESSAR is the only company in Paradip which is number one in the State in terms of employing local people and engaging local contractors. He opined that the nearby basti area should be rehabilitated. He demanded for a diploma institute at Paradip and a traffic post near IFFCO/ AM/NS square.

17. Bishnu Charan Swain, Pankapal, Kujang

He welcomed the project with a request to solve the water drainage problem in Paradip. He requested to start peripheral development before establishment of the project.

18. Bimal Pattnaik, Nuagarh G.P.

He highlighted that old ESSAR plant has employed 89 local engineers and many local people. People in general are therefore in support of this project. However, they are demanding without making proper review of the employment provided.

19. Sudhal kumar Swain (M.P. Representative), Nuagarh

He welcomed the project with a request to district administration to examine the demands of people. He suggested that the company should take responsibility for benefits of the basti people. He highlighted that ESSAR has given highest employment in the area in the past and therefore the new project should come up. He requested SPCB to take care of the aspects of air and water pollution and the industry should start plantation activities immediately. He further

suggested for formation of a 25 member committee involving 10 local basti people.

20. Sarada Prasanna Behera, Paradeep

He identified himself as student representative of BPUT and emphasized on recruitment of local degree engineers in various industries. He intimated that there are so many unemployed degree engineers in the area who are not finding any proper procedure through which they could apply for their employment.

21. Nagendra Kumar Swain, Bisuali

He stated that people are the real owner of the land and the proposed land for this project has not been properly accounted for. He said that the project should be established and they should resolve the water drainage issue in the nearby area.

22. Harekrushna Mohanty, kujang


He remained absent.


23. Ajay Kumar Chowdhury, Chakradharapur

He demanded for construction of the damaged road from PPL main Gate to National Highway and for expansion of the existing road from Bhutamundai to Dochhaki to minimize road accidents. He requested for avenue plantation and afforestation in vacant areas in the surrounding.

24. Manoj Kumar Nayak, Paradeep Youth Association

Summarizing all the demands and concerns of all other speakers he supported the project and requested to fulfill public demands such as solving the water drainage problem in the basti area, drinking water supply to the bastis, local employment, systematic procedure for employment and establishment of technical institutes and superspeciality hospital.





The public raised the following issues and apprehensions for redressal by the project proponent.


1. To fulfill all the commitments made during public hearing in terms of pollution control and prevention measures
2. To start plantation activities at the proposed land before establishment of the project
3. To develop skill levels of local people and to provide local employment in all categories of posts
4. To maintain a recruitment procedure for employment of local people and to employ them by open advertisement
5. To utilize CSR fund only in development of peripheral areas
6. To locate vacant land inside Paradeep and do plantation
7. To take up with existing industries and district administration for establishment of a superspeciality hospital in Paradeep.
8. To take up with district administration to resolve the storm water drainage issues at the adjacent Balijhara & Bauriapalanda bastis.


Views of the Project Proponent on the issues raised by the public during the Public hearing

Sri Prakash Chandra Mohapatra, Director (Projects) addressed the issues raised by public and committed that

1. All pollution control measures will be world class and all air and water pollution control measures will be taken as declared in the EIA report and committed during the public hearing.
2. All the demands made by public will be fulfilled in consultation with District administration.

3. Plantation at the site will be started immediately after construction of the boundary wall. Sapling distribution will also be done to public for doing plantation at their respective places.
4. The industry will take part in funding for establishment of superspeciality hospital and other common developmental activities at Paradeep with other industrial houses.

It is brought to the notice of all concerned that M/s Essar Minmet Limited has proposed to have Environmental Assessment for installation of 14 (7x2) MTPA capacity Greenfield Pellet Plant at Paradeep in the district of Jagatsinghpur to obtain Environmental Clearance from the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Govt. of India. The proponent has applied to the State Pollution Control Board, Odisha, Bhubaneswar for a Public Hearing.

By virtue of Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change, Government of India Notification No. S.O. 1533 (E) Dtd. 14.09.2006, the Board has been authorized to conduct environmental public hearing and as such invites suggestions, views, comments and objections on matters relating to environmental aspects of the proposed project from all the persons including concrete residents, environmental groups and others located at the proposed site/sites of displacement/sites likely to be affected.

For the above purpose, a person will only mean:

- A. Any person who is likely to be affected by the grant of Environmental Clearance.
- B. Any person who owns his control over the project with respect to which an application has been submitted for environmental clearance.
- C. Any association of persons, whether incorporated or likely to be affected by the project and/or functioning in the field of environment.
- D. Any local authority within any part of whose local limits is within the neighborhood, wherein the project is proposed to be located.

Persons as above who desire to submit their views, comments, objections etc. relevant to the project may do so in writing within 30 days from the date of publication of this notice addressing the same to the Member Secretary, State Pollution Control Board, Odisha through Registered Post.
