PROCEEDINGS OF THE PUBLIC HEARING FOR EXPANSION OF EXISTING FRP PLANT FROM 1.35 LTPA [HOT ROLLED COIL (HRC) & COLD ROLLED COIL (CRC)] TO 5.85 LTPA HOT ROLLED COIL (HRC) INCLUDING EXISTING 1.35 LTPA COLD ROLLED COIL (CRC) OVER AN AREA OF 24.031 HA, AT- VILLAGES JAMDA & JAMDA (NIMPALI) UNDER HIRAKUD TEHSIL OF SAMBALPUR DISTRICT HELD ON 09.03.2022 AT 11.00 A.M. IN THE DISTRICT AUDITORIUM, NEAR CIRCUIT HOUSE IN THE DISTRICT OF SAMBALPUR.

Sri Umakanta Raj, OAS (S), Additional District Magistrate, Sambalpur presided over the meeting along with Er. Ramesh Kumar Ekka, Regional Officer, State Pollution Control Board, Sambalpur, Odisha.

At the outset, Er. Ramesh Kumar Ekka, Regional Officer, State Pollution Control Board, Sambalpur welcomed the public present in the meeting. He briefly described the objective of the public hearing conducted as per the provisions of EIA Notification No. S.O. 1533(E) of Dt.14th September 2006 of the Ministry of Environment and Forests & Climate Change (MOEF & CC), Government of India. He also informed that the date, time and venue for conducting the public hearing meeting for the proposed expansion of existing FRP plant from 1.35 LTPA [Hot Rolled Coil (HRC) & Cold Rolled Coil (CRC)] to 5.85 LTPA Hot Rolled Coil (HRC) including existing 1.35 LTPA Cold Rolled Coil CRC) over an area of 24.031 Ha, At-villages Jamda, & Jamda (Nimpali) under Hirakud Tehsil of Sambalpur district held on 09.03.2022 at 11.00 A.M. in the District Auditorium, Near Circuit House in the district of Sambalpur was duly advertised in Odia daily "Prameya", dtd. 04.02.2022 and English daily "The Times of India" dtd. 04.02.2022 (Paper clipping are enclosed as Annexure-I).

The Addl. District Magistrate, Sambalpur has also briefed about the proposed FRP expansion project and requested the public who were present during the public hearing meeting to express their opinion and views on the proposed project. He requested the representative of the project to brief about their proposed project before the public.

On behalf of the project proponent, Mr. Krishna Kumar Padhi, Sr VP-HR (Hirakud Complex) & Mr. Soubhagya Kumar Tripathy, GM (Environment & Sustainability) of M/s Hindalco

Industries Limited, Bhubanewar briefed the following points about the proposed project in the public hearing meeting.

- 1. M/s Hindalco Industrics Limited proposes the expansion of existing the Hirakud FRP plant from 1.35 Lac TPA Hot Rolled Coil & Cold Rolled Coil to 5.85 Lac TPA Hot Rolled Coil including existing 1.35 Lac TPA Cold Rolled Coil at villages Jamda, Jamda (Nimpali), Tehsil Hirakud, District Sambalpur, Odisha.
- 2. As per the EIA notification dated 14th Sept 2006 and subsequent amendments, the project falls under Category "B" project of Activity 3 (a). The plant area, (existing 19.401 Ha and additional land for expansion 4.63 Ha), total project area 24.031 Ha.
- 3. The unit-wise configuration and capacity of existing and proposed project as explained is stated below:
 - a) HRC (Hot Rolled Coil): From 1.35 Lac TPA to 5.85 Lac TPA (Expansion)
 - b) CRC (Cold Rolled Coil): 1.35 Lac TPA (No Change), CRC will be produced from the HRC only.
- 4. The salient features of the proposed expansion project, as stated by the proponent are
 - a) No Resettlement & Rehabilitation (R&R) is involved in the land required as the additional land required for the proposed expansion (4.63 Ha) is already under possession of the company.
 - b) No National Parks, Wildlife Sanctuaries, Biosphere Reserves, Eco Sensitive Zones are there within the 10 km radius study area of the plant site.
 - c) Additional employment opportunity (Approx. 200 persons) will be generated.
 - d) Water and Power requirement will be sourced from Hirakud Captive Power Plant. No additional permission for water and power supply is required.
 - e) The existing and proposed expansion plant is and will be Zero Liquid Discharge (ZLD). Approx. 35% of the total water requirement of the FRP Plant is being and will be met through recycled water.
 - f) Existing hazardous waste generated from the FRP Plant is being co-processed in the cement plant/recycled.
 - g) No hazardous waste is being disposed of in land filling.

- h) It is proposed to invest around 1500 Crores in the FRP expansion project. Cost for Environmental Protection Measures: Capital Cost: Rs. 35.40 Crores/- and Recurring Cost: Rs. 2.79 Crores /annum.
- i) This plant is manufacturing following import substitute Aluminium products first time in India and helping India to become "Atmanirbhar" in these products segment,
 - Aerospace grade Aluminium Flat Products (Plate/Sheet) for Satellite, Missile,
 Tanker etc.
 - · Can Body Stock Aluminium Sheets/Coils for Electronic components.
- 5. The proponent also stated the benefits of the expansion project as followings:
 - a) Generation of direct and indirect employment opportunities in the region and preference to be given to local people as per their eligibility.
 - b) Business opportunities for local community will be available like transport of raw material and product.
 - c) Increased revenue to the State & Central exchequer from the plant.
 - d) Plant will result in considerable growth of service sector. Socio-Economic status of surrounding residents will improve.
- 6. Major Requirements for Expansion Project
 - a) The raw materials required for the proposed expansion project include 1.35 LTPA lngots from Hirakud Smelter (2 km via Road by trucks / Trailers of 25 T capacity) and 4.50 LTPA Sheet Ingots from Aditya Aluminium (Unit of Hindalco Industries Ltd.) (40 km via Road by trucks / Trailers of 25 T capacity).
 - b) Fuel required for the proposed expansion project include premium LSHS/LDO (Sulphur <= 1.5%) (21450 KLA) from Oil Refineries at Barauni/Haldia/ Vizag and PNG (86.32 million SCM) by GAIL (India) Ltd.
 - c) Premium LSHS/LDO shall be replaced with PNG in Melting-Holding furnaces, subject to the availability by GAIL (India) Ltd.
- 7. Environmental Baseline Study has been done in summer season (March 2021 to May 2021). The details of the monitoring/sampling were done for
 - a) Ambient Air Quality Monitoring. Done at 10 locations. Air Quality Monitoring results shows (existing baseline data: $PM_{10} \sim 61.5$ to $90.5 \mu g/m^3$, $PM_{2.5} = 28.9$ to $51.9 \mu g/m^3$, $SO_2 = 5.6$ to $17.3 \mu g/m^3$, $NO_2 = 12.3$ to $28.7 \mu g/m^3$, $CO \sim BDL$ to $0.98 \mu g/m^3$), Max.

- Incremental GLC after Expansion Project PM2.5 1.62 μ g/m³, PM₁₀ -4.06 μ g/m³, SO₂ 0.29 μ g/m³, NO₂ -1.81 μ g/m³ etc).
- b) Noise Level Monitoring. Done at 09 locations. Noise Level during day time 52.3 to 67.3 Leq dB (A), Noise Level during night time 42.0 to 58.6 Leq dB (A).
- c) Surface Water Sampling. Done at 06 locations. The results shows that pH varies from 7.21 to 7.62, Total dissolved solid varies from 128 to 236 mg/l, Alkalinity (72.61 to 134.52 mg/l) and conductivity (201.00 to 352.00 µS/cm) & Total hardness (85.66 to 132.68 mg/l), COD (BDL to 12.0 mg/l), BOD (BDL to 3.5 mg/l) and Dissolved oxygen (6.2 to 7.0 mg/l).
- d) Ground Water Sampling. Done at 08 locations. The result shows that pH varies 7.36 to 7.86, Total Dissolved Solids vary from 362 to 753 mg/l, Alkalinity (194.76 to 332.23 mg/l), total hardness (187.65 to 423.32 mg/l), chlorides (66.98 to 187.69 mg/l), fluoride (0.66 to 1.14 mg/l) and sulphates (23.64 to 102.57 mg/l) etc.
- e) Soil sampling. Done at 08 locations. The results show that the soil samples majorly exhibit different colour of soil viz. Brownish, Brownish Black, Brown, Dark Brown, Reddish Brown & the texture of the soil samples majorly was Silt Loam, Clay Loam, Silt Clay Loam & Sandy Loam. The result show pH ranges from 7.12 to 7.41; where nutrients remain in available form in the soil with organic matter (0.73% to 1.18%) optimum, nitrogen (124.80 to 283.70 kg/ha) is from good to better, phosphorus (20.29 to 41.00 kg/ha) and potassium (193.40 to 336.00 kg/ha) is medium to better, Magnesium (153.61 to 391.65 mg/kg), & Calcium (1270.39 to 2914.35 mg/kg).
- 8. Following environment management preventive measures are being taken in the existing facility and proposed to be taken in the expansion projects to control the emissions/discharges well within the norms are stated below:
 - a) Particulate Matter (major air pollutant emitted from the FRP plant stacks): Demisters installed in stacks to ensure PM emission levels within the prescribed limits i.e., 50 mg/Nm³.
 - b) Fugitive dust emission: Mobile vacuum dust sweeping system on industrial roads and vacuum dust cleaning system for plant area. Regular road washing on internal roads
 - c) Gaseous emission- cleaner fuel i.c., Premium LSHS/LDO or PNG (gas subject to availability)

- d) Stack Emission- CEMS (Continuous Emission Monitoring System) & 2 EQMS installed in FRP Plant for periodic monitoring of air with Real Time Data communication to SPCB & CPCB sever
- e) Wastewater Management The existing plant is a Zero discharge Facility and after expansion it will continue to be a zero-discharge facility. Industrial Effluent will be treated in existing ETP with RO (To be upgraded from 120 KLD to 400 KLD) & existing STP (100 KLD), respectively. Treated water will be used for greenbelt development / plantation. There is a storm water collection pit capacity 750 KL where storm water is being collected and settled before discharging the excess water outside during monsoon and heavy rain. During normal rain the storm water collected at the pit is sent to ETP and is recycled as process water.
- f) Hazardous waste Co-processing in the kiln /sold to authorized TSDF.
- g) Greenbelt Development & Plantation Within the Plant Premises.
- h) Occupational Health & Safety Measures- Occupational health surveillance program taken as a regular exercise for all the employees and their records maintained.
- i) Major Activities Carried Out So Far Under CSR For FRP Plant Education, Health Care Facilities, Infrastructure Development, Sustainable Livelihood, Social Causes.
- 9. The proposed expansion project will be implemented only by modification in the FRP plant. Thus, there will be no major adverse impact due to the proposed expansion project. However, adequate mitigation measures will be implemented to ensure emission levels will maintained within prescribed nerms. Compliance monitoring is being and will be carried on regular basis during and after project completion. The proposed expansion project will be implemented in sustainable manner and will result in growth of the surrounding areas by creatingdirect &indirect employment opportunities in the region including ancillary developments and supporting infrastructures.

The Addl. District Magistrate, Sambalpur invited the public to keep their views on environmental related issues for the proposed project.

About 300-320 participants have attended the public hearing meeting and out of them 196 participants have put their signature in the attendance sheet whose list is annexed as **Annexure-II**. 77 persons were registered their names to deliver their views during public hearing and out of them 76 persons have delivered their views. List is annexed as **Annexure-III**.
