



**PROCEEDINGS OF THE PUBLIC HEARING FOR GRANT OF ENVIRONMENTAL CLEARANCE FOR THE PROPOSED CHANDIPOSHI IRON ORE BLOCK OF M/S. RUNGTA MINES LTD. FOR PEAK PRODUCTION CAPACITY OF 1.0 MTPA (ROM) IRON ORE WITH TOTAL EXCAVATION – 1.0945 MTPA (ROM IRON ORE: 1.0 MTPA + WASTE 0.0945 MTPA) ALONG WITH 2X250 TPH MOBILE CRUSHING AND 3X350TPH MOBILE SCREENING PLANTS OVER MINE LEASE AREA OF 131.580 HA., AT: BADAINDUPUR, SANUA, SARGIGARH & TEHREI VILLAGES UNDER KOIRA TAHASIL OF SUNDARGARH DISTRICT HELD ON DTD. 03.08.2022, AT 10.00 A.M AT THE OPEN GROUND NEAR SANINDUPUR CHOWK OF SANINDUPUR VILLAGE, TAHSIL: KOIRA, IN THE DISTRICT OF SUNDARGARH.**

The public hearing of M/s. Rungta Mines Ltd. for grant of Environmental Clearance for the proposed Chandiposhi Iron Ore Block for peak production capacity of 1.0 MTPA (ROM) iron ore with total excavation – 1.0945 MTPA (ROM Iron Ore: 1.0 MTPA + Waste 0.0945 MTPA) along with 2X250 TPH mobile crushing and 3x350 TPH mobile screening plants over mine lease area of 131.580 Ha. was held on dtd. 03.08.2022 at 10.00 AM at the Open Ground near Sanindupur Chowk of Sanindupur Village, Tahsil: Koira in the district of Sundargarh. Sri Shiba Toppo, Additional District Magistrate, Sundargarh, supervised and presided over the Public Hearing Process. Dr. Binod Bihari Dash, Senior Environmental Scientist and Regional Officer, State Pollution Control Board, Odisha, Rourkela delivered welcome address, organized and conducted the public hearing meeting in association with District Administration. During the course of Public Hearing, the guidelines for Covid-19 have been duly followed.

The Public Hearing in respect of the above proposed Chandiposhi Iron Ore Block stated as per the schedule and the venue decided by the District Magistrate in accordance with the EIA Notification S.O.1533 (E) dated 14.09.2006 and subsequent amendment therein. The State Pollution Control Board, Odisha, Bhubaneswar had advertised in newspaper in Odia daily- Dharitri on dtd. 28.06.2022 and in English daily- The Times of India on dtd.28.06.2022. The Public Hearing meeting with regards to date, place and time was announced in public address system apart from its publication in local dailies. The attendance sheet of the public attended the public hearing is annexed as Annexure – I. Around 126 persons had attended the public hearing meeting where as 50 persons had delivered their views whose list is annexed as Annexure II.

At the outset, Dr. Binod Bihari Dash, Regional Officer, State Pollution Control Board, Odisha, Rourkela welcomed the panel members and the public presented in the meeting. He briefly described the objectives and procedure followed for conducting the Public Hearing as per





the EIA Notification S.O.1533 (E) dated 14.09.2006 of Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change (MoEF & CC), Govt. of India. He also explained about the importance of such hearing for the proposed Chandiposhi Iron Ore Block of M/s. Rungta Mines Ltd. for peak production capacity of 1.0 MTPA (ROM) iron ore with total excavation – 1.0945 MTPA (ROM Iron Ore: 1.0 MTPA + Waste 0.0945 MTPA) along with 2X250 TPH mobile crushing and 3x350 TPH mobile screening plants over mine lease area of 131.580 Ha for grant of Environmental Clearance and also invited views, comments, objections & opinions of the public which are necessary while considering the environmental clearance of the project and he also told that those who want to give their written statement about the proposed projects, they can do so during the public hearing process. He requested Additional District Magistrate, Sundargarh to preside over the meeting.

Welcoming the public, the panel members, Press Media, Police Officers and the assembled public in the meeting, Sri Shiba Toppo, Additional District Magistrate, Sundargarh, briefly explained the about the purpose of the public hearing about the proposed Chandiposhi Iron Ore Block of M/s. Rungta Mines Ltd., At: Badaindupur, Sanua, Sargigarh & Tehrei villages under Koira Tahasil of Sundargarh District. He also described the importance of environmental impact studies carried out for the proposed Iron Ore Block and the views, comments, objections and opinions of the public are necessary while considering the Environmental Clearance of the project. He told that the project proponent will present the summary of environmental impact studies for the proposed project for the knowledge of the Public. He invited the villagers to present their views, opinions & objections about the proposed project on environmental consideration. He also told that the public can also submit written representations. The proceeding along with video recording of the meeting will be forwarded to the Government for further decision making process for grant of Environmental Clearance. He requested the Regional Officer, SPCB, Odisha, Rourkela to carry out further proceeding of the meeting.



Regional Officer, SPCB, Odisha, Rourkela asked the representative of Project Proponent of M/s. Rungta Mines Ltd., to make a brief presentation before the public gathered in the meeting about the details of environmental impact assessment report of the proposed project in a simple summarized manner for better understanding of the Public.

On behalf of the Project Proponent, Shri Dillip Kumar Parida, Senior General Manager (Mining), M/s. Rungta Mines Ltd. welcomed the panel members, public and all other participants and gave a brief description about the Chandiposhi Iron Ore Block of M/s. Rungta Mines Ltd. He expressed the details of proposed project which are as follows:

- The virgin iron ore block of Chandiposhi Iron Ore Block located at Villages, Bada-indupur, Sanua Sargigarh and Teherai has been awarded to Rungta Mines Limited as the highest bidder in the auction process conducted by the Government of Odisha. For this Odisha Government, has issued Letter of Intent (LOI) vide letter no. 8719 dated 28.10.2021. The proposed mine measuring 131.58 hectares will be leased for a period of 50 years from the date of execution of the lease. The new proposed mine located in Tehsil Koira, District, Sundargarh has proposed an annual production of 1 million tonnes of iron ore with a total mining capacity of 1.0945 (including 0.945 million tonnes of waste) and will use mobile crushing plants and mobile screening plants for the same.
- Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change, Government of India has issued TOR for preparation of EIA/EMP report of the project vide their letter No. IA-J-11015/8/2022-I-A-II(NCM) Dated 11.03.2022. In this context, M/s. Min mec Consultancy Pvt. Ltd. has been appointed for preparation of EIA/EMP report. The Indian Bureau of Mines has approved the proposed mining plan for preparation of 1 million tonnes of Iron Ore per annum vide letter No.MPA/20-ORI-13AHS/2021-22, dated 24.11.2021.
- Various programs for environmental management and development will be adopted if the proposed mine becomes operational. The emission noise and vibration will be controlled by plate tripod and control valve. Water will be sprinkled by tanks on Haul Road. Coir matting, plantation and grass seeding will be done for proper management of the dump. Retaining wall, garland drain and settling tank will be provided at the lower part of the dump. Extensive plantation of trees will be done in other vacant areas of the proposed mine, green belt area. Remedial measures will be regularly tested and displayed for public viewing through electronic boards. Extensive planting of trees around mine lease will minimize sound wave penetration. Mining operations and tailings will be treated as per regulations by regulatory agencies. Air quality in this area is within acceptable limits and even if there is slight increase after commencement of mining activities, it will be kept within the permissible limits by proper management by the company. Other environmental management plans will be done as per the environmental impact assessment and environmental management plan of the appointed Min mec Consultancy Pvt. Ltd.
- In this project, the local people will be given jobs directly and indirectly based on their merit. Provision will be made for free health care, ambulance and medicines, etc. For the improvement of education, construction of school houses, provision of toilets, etc., improvement of rural roads, development of sports and culture, and various programs will be introduced for the development of livelihood and animal resources. Programs will be made for social development along with education, health, and livelihood.




Then the Regional Officer, SPCB, Rourkela at hen invited the public to register their names to put forth their views, suggestion, comments and objections on matters relating to environmental aspects of the project. Then the public deliberated on various issues one by one which are as follows


1. Sri Ananda Barik, Teherai Village:

He greeted & welcomed the panel members, gathered public and all other participants to the meeting. He welcomed public hearing and supported the project. He demanded employment for the people of surrounding villages. He briefly stated about the previous good works of the Company in health, education, drinking water facility, etc. He demanded two more ambulances in addition to four numbers already provided, after resumption of the proposed mining projects. Further, he added that, the Company has concretised the road and provided street light for easy passage of local people. During the pandemic period, the Company launched massive awareness programmes and distributed masks to each household. He also said that, the Company has made avenue plantation on the road from Kolmong to Koira and Koira to Tahasil Chak. He requested the Company to maintain the expectation of the people in future also. He appraised that the company has been providing 4 nos. of fruit bearing saplings to each household and demanded that the same should be extended to Sanua, Ranisal, Sargigarh, Bada Indupur and Sanindpur villages. The company has been supporting various religious festivals of the area. He stated that, although the mine has not yet in operation, they have already started development works in the surrounding villages. He praised the Company as the synonymous of development in the area. He expressed his support in favour of the project.


2. Sri Rabindra Kumar Mishra, District Secretary, BJD, Sundergarh, Tensa:

He supported the views expressed by the previous speaker. He demanded that the natural water resources present in the area should not get disturbed. He also demanded that the company should also ensure the nearby area as malaria free. He requested the company to promote women education in nearby villages. The people of the area are dependent on mines for their livelihood since other livelihood programmes are very scarce. Hence, he requested the company to provide employment to local people on the basis of their skill and education and also requirement of the company. 3. Sri Anil Barda, Village Teherai:  
He requested the company to make self-reliance for livelihood to each and every household of the project affected area. He also requested the company to pay special attention to education of the area.
4. Sri Anadi Palei, Village Teherai:  
He expressed his support in favour of the project and demanded water supply facility at Teherai Chak.
5. Sri Pandu Munda, Village Teherai:  
He expressed his support in favour of the project.
6. Sri Bijay Kumar Dehury, Village Teherai:  
He demanded support to various religious festivals of Sanua, Sargigarh, Teherai and Bada Indupur villages. He also demanded one additional School Bus to Koira. As a representative of 4 villages; Sanua, Sargigarh, Teherai and Bada Indupur, he expressed his support in favour of the project.
7. Sri Kumud Barick, Village Teherai:  
He expressed his view in favour of the project.
8. Sri Suresh Naik, Block Chairman, Koira:  
He expressed his support in favour of the project. He demanded plantation in peripheral areas and protection of small patches of adjoining forest with barbed wire fencing. He requested the company to assist the nearby SHG groups to become self-reliant.
9. Sri Parameswar Naik, Ex-Zilla Parishad, Koira:  
He appreciated the Company's peripheral development works in the area and said that due to the company's mines being auctioned to other lessees the peripheral villagers of those leases are being deprived of the facilities those was provided by the company earlier. He appreciated the company's help to a cancer patient and one physically disabled fellow of the area. He demanded maintenance of transporting road.
10. Sri Sarat Barick, Village Ranital:  
He demanded employment to people of Ranisal and Patmunda.
11. Sri Purna Pujari, Koira:  
He expressed his enthusiasm that the project would bring development and employment to the area. Hence, he requested the Govt. authorities to issued environmental clearance to the proposed project at an early.
12. Sri Duryodhan Naik, Koira:  
He expressed his support in favour of the project.



13. Sri Laxmi Narayan Jaiswal, Koira:

He reiterated that the revenue collected from mining from this area is utilised for the development of the entire country. But unless there is development of the local people, the term development loses its significance. He requested the administration to intervene in the man-animal conflict of the area. He also requested the district administration to build check dams along Suna Nadi and Teherai Nadi to maintain adequate water resource and protection of the water resources. The people of the area are relied on Govt. for jobs which are not a feasible solution. However, M/s Rungta Mines Ltd. has made it possible by establishing a Steel Plant in Kamanda. In his final note he requested the Company to continue upholding the faith in future also.

14. Sri Santosh Kumar Sahoo, Village Kalta:


He expressed his view in favour of the project. He expressed his view in favour of the project. People were getting benefits from the forest. Local did not know anything and depend on forest for their livelihood. He expressed his uncertainty the local people will get the benefit from the project or not.


15. Sri Biswajit Mallick, Human Right Activist, Sundergarh :

He thanked the local people to invite him to the public hearing. First of all he expressed his concern over man-elephant conflict in the study area and requested the administration to intervene in the matter. He added that, although there is development in the area, still uneducated people are also present and he requested the district administration to make a good School and a good College in the area. He further added that the administration should improve the health care system in the area. He requested the company to make the locals self reliant by preparation and implementation of plans related to livelihood improvement like pisciculture, floriculture and agriculture, etc. He finally concluded that, there should be maintenance of human rights in the area.

16. Sri Bhimsen Choudhury, Ex-MLA, Bonai :

He supported the views of the first speaker namely Sri Anand Barik regarding developmental works taken up by Rungta Mines Ltd. since long. Sri Anand Barick and requested the company to protect the Teherai Nala and maintain the lift irrigation system of Sanua and Sargigarh villages. He expressed his support in favour of the project.

17. Sri Prafulla Samal, Secretary, Odisha Mineral Workers Union:

He expressed his dissatisfaction over the new mining lessee other than Rungta Mines Ltd. that they are not taking care of the river and not paying adequate wages to the workers. He then expressed his satisfaction on Rungta Mines Ltd. and expressed his support in favour of the project.

18. Sri Santosh Barik, Village Teherai :

He supported the project.

19. Sri Sanu Palei, Village Sargigarh:

He supported in favour of the project.

20. Sri Parameswar Barik, Village Ranital:

He expressed his support in favour of the project quoting some conditions. Although the village Ranital was not considered for Gram Sabha, he demanded development of education, road, health and street light in Ranital village, providing employment to Ranital villagers, dissemination of village pond, financial assistance to old age people, One Rahas Mandap in Ranital village, drinking water and club house in Munda Basti of Ranital village, plantation of fruit bearing trees on Govt. land for livelihoods of persons of his village, assistance to SHG Groups, maintenance of migratory route of elephants and barbed wire fencing around his village, financial assistance for religious festivals of his village, financial provision for priest and Prasad offered to Sani & Hanuman temple of his village should be given by Rungta Mines Ltd. The company should pay attention towards ground vibration and dust pollution. The company should give transporting work to their villagers. Finally, he expected that the company will pay attention to his demand and expressed his support in favour of the project.

21. Sri Mintu Ghana, Village Sargigarh


He expressed his expectation that the problem exist in his village will be solved by the company such as; permanent employment, development of temple. He finally expressed his support in favour of the project.


22. Sri Rabindra Barik, Village Sargigarh:

23. Sri Karunakar Patra, Block President, BJD, Koira:

Firstly, he expressed his dissatisfaction that none of the previous speakers have deliberated the main focus area of the public hearing. I.e; environment issues. He said that there would be noise, water and air pollution after the mine resume operation and requested the company to take all mitigative measures as suggested in the EIA/EMP report. He further suggested that since due to mining the endemic species, ie;. Sal of the



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lease area would be felled, the company should take initiative to transplant Sal trees with the help of transplanter.

24. Sri Madan Ghana, Village Sargigarh:

He whole heartedly supported the project and demanded development of health care facility and employment.

25. Sri Shyam Sunder Barick, Village Sargigarh:

He expressed support in favour of the project and demanded employment for 4 villages of Patmunda Panchayat.

26. Sri Madhab Sethi, Village Sargigarh:

He whole heartedly supported the project.

27. Sri Gangadhar Palei, Village Sargigarh:

He expressed support in favour of the project and demanded employment for the people.

28. Sri Sahadev Ghana, Village Sargigarh:

He expressed support in favour of the project.

29. Sri Pradeep Ghana, Village Sargigarh:

He welcomed the public hearing and requested the company not to check flow of water to the check dam constructed from Sargigarh to Ghagragoda. He also demanded that in lieu of Sal deforestation, plantation should be made in other vacant areas to compensate the loss. He expressed his dissatisfaction that adequate number of saplings are not being distributed and instead of giving 5 saplings to one person, each person should be given one sapling and properly take care of it. The local people should be given direct employment by the company instead of employment through contractor. He also stated that since students are travelling 60 km to & fro to Joda for education, the company should pay attention to open an English Medium School in their area. Everybody should get wages as per their work.

30. Sri Kapila Palei, Village Sanua:


He demanded School teacher and water supply facility to his village.

He suggested the gatherings that their expectation will only be fulfilled after the mine resume operation. So, everybody should support the opening of the mines. In addition to this, he demanded water, electricity and street light facility for his villages and direct employment instead of employment under contractor.

35. Smt. Surbali Palei, Village Sargigarh :  
She first expressed her support in favour of the project and told that there will be development of health, education, road, etc. after the mines resume operation. Finally, she requested to arrange a School bus.
36. Sri Choudhury Behera, Village Sanua:  
He expressed his support in favour of the project.
37. Sri Sudhansu Sekhar Ghana, Village Sanua:  
He supported the project.
38. Sri Chandramani Palei, Village Sanua:  
He supported the project.
39. Sri Mahendra Behera, Village Sanua:  
He supported the project.
40. Sri Skudeba Palei, Sanua:  
He expressed support in favour of the project. he demanded that, pipeline water supply should be installed in the deep bore well of their village and the company should meet the expectation of their villagers.


49. Sri Mithun Behera, Village Sanua:




