Sri Rajanikant Swain, Additional District Magistrate (General), Angul District, supervised and presided over the meeting, along with was Dr. Anup Kumar Mallick, Regional officer, State Pollution Control Board, Angul and the representative of State Pollution Control Board, Odisha, Bhubaneswar.

At the outset Dr. Anup Kumar Mallick, Regional Officer, SPC Board, Angul welcomed the other panel member from the district administration, and villagers from the villages, the media representatives and gave an introduction about the guidelines to be followed for the public hearing in the light of EIA Notifications 2006 in respect of Environmental Assessment of Project proposed by the M/s Jindal Steel Odisha Ltd for its project for Expansion of Pellet Plant from 5.0 MTPA to 26.0 MTPA and Hot Rolling mill from 3.1 MTPA to 21.1 MTPA along with setting up 19.2 MTPA Integrated Steel Plant (DRI plant- 5.4 MTPA, Sinter Plant- 11.5 MTPA, Coke Oven-5.17 MTPA, Blast Furnace- 14.0 MTPA, EAF- 6.0 MTPA, BOF- 13.2 MTPA, Wire Rod Mill-1.2 MTPA, CRM- 7.5 MTPA, Calcination plant-7200 TPD, Oxygen plant- 11000 TPD, Captive Power Plant (Gas based)- 550 MW, Ferro Alloy plant- 0.376 MTPA) and 12.5 MTPA Cement plant at Villages Basudevpur, Panpur, Kaliakata Jungle, Ramadiha, Kaliakata, Sankerjang, Sankerjang Jungle, Badakerjang, Badakerjang Jungle, Jamunda, Jamunda Jungle, Paripara and Jarada, Tehsil- Chhendipada & Banarpal, District-Angul, Odisha

Sri Alok Kumar Sahu, on behalf of the project proponent M/s Jindal Steel Odisha Ltd in the presence of the EIA consultant M/s J M Consultants Pvt Ltd, Gurgaon addressed the committee members and the assembled public in local language Odia giving a brief description about the proposed project and about the baseline study done by the consultant and the environmental management including the pollution control measures proposed for air and water pollution control & solid waste-management of the project. The copy of the statement of the industry read out at public hearing proceedings in Odia and in English is enclosed.

Regarding public hearing of the proposed project notices have been was publicized at one English Daily newspaper and one Odia daily newspaper before one month. It was also publicized at the office notice board of all the Gram Panchayat offices. Public




hearing also publicized through loud speaker at the concerned villages such as Basudevpur, Panpur, Kaliakata Jungle, Ramadiha, Kaliakata, Sankerjang, Sankerjang Jungle, Badakerjang, Badakerjang Jungle, Jamunda, Jamunda Jungle, Paripara And Jarada.

Dr. Anup Kumar Mallick, Regional Officer, State Pollution Control Board, Regional Office, Angul & representative of State Pollution Control Board Odisha then invited the public to present their views about the proposed project on environmental consideration.

The views expressed by various speakers are as follows:

01	Sri Ahykaya Kumar Samanta, Sankerjang village land giver and Chairman of Angul Municipality
	He said that for the establishment of Jindal Steel plant in the year 2006-07 the land acquisition was started and all the villagers have given have discussed and had given their consent for the establishment of this steel plant. They know that for setting up a good steel plant there will be various problems including the pollution. Still they took that decision to allow the steel plant to come up because we understood that there will be economic condition improvement, and development, there will be employment for our children and overall development of the Angul area and region. So, this steel plant has come up with their consent and now it has been planned to expand this plant to make it one of the largest in the Asia sub-continent and it is a welcoming step for us and Angul region. They had expected great improvement in the economic condition of the people and the area. So far there has been lots of development in Angul region due to the plant but it could have been far more in comparison to the how much the people have suffered. All people should have got more benefits. It is required to increase the development work around the area from the CSR fund of Jindal Steel. They don't oppose the steel plant which capacity will increase from 6.0 MTPA to 25.2 MTPA, but all need to be aware, this plant is our plant. Authorities and plant officers will come and go, but the local people will be there their children will be there, they need to be given priority. Those people who wants to do small business, they should be given priority. All the industries even the NALCO, MCL area also polluting, Jindal steel



	<p>pollution may be less, but it is a request to the administration and Jindal steel specifically to their Chairman, Mr Navin Jindal to set up a very high standard Hospital in Angul area, where all people can be treated for free. We all brother and sister on discussing with our self should allow the plant to increase their capacity. All should support the expansion of the plant where a very advanced and a large steel plant will be set up which will be our pride for people of Angul. He also demanded that every month Jindal Steel should conduct meeting with peripheral villages to sort out all the their problems.</p>
02	<p>Sri Narendra Kumar Karana, Ramadiha village</p> <p>He said, we the resident of Angul area feel proud that Jindal has established a large plant in this area. We are thankful that Mr Navin Jindal has set up this great plant at this place and he is also going to expand this plant. This plant at one location will produce 25 million tons of steel. This meeting we are learning the impact of the expansion on our environment. In this meeting Jindal Steel officer informed about the pollution control measures from the expansion project and protection of our environment. However, we also request to take care of the gas from the existing CGP plant. There should not be any bad impact on our life due to the project and give us our livelihood to live. Jindal Steel officer was told about the employment to be given. He questioned about if all land losers have received employments. But there has been discrepancy in the appointments and salary of the local people. He questioned that they are not land seller, they are land looser or land giver. Local persons have been given jobs in sister company of Jindal Steel where their salary is less in comparison to who have been appointed in mother company Jindal Steel. There has been increment and DA in their salary but it is less. We are not aware what is the criteria for engagement for employment and the salary structure. There should be provision to engage those who were children when the land was acquired and now have grown up. It is my request to control the air pollution, water pollution, noise pollution, gas pollution by engaging very good quality plant and equipment by the company and the administration else we will be suffer similar problem as Bhopal. We are not aware of any association of employee in Jindal as they are available in NALCO and MCL. Finally, as land looser we</p>

04	Sri Dilip Kumar Pradhan, 25 Zone Zilla Parishad
	He said he is from 25 Zone Zilla Parishad covering three village Panchyat. He said apart from taking land from Jindal steel & Power Ltd this company Jindal steel Odisha has to acquired 882 Ac of land. For this Land acquisition 2013 policy should be implemented. 90%, 60%, 30% as of the job should be given to the local people per the HLCA guidelines out of the 6550 permanent jobs out of total 9400 employment proposed, atleast 80% jobs should be given to locals. Those who have been employed under contractual condition should be made permanent after 6 months/ 1 years. Local people should be preferred when having same qualification. There is discrepancy between salary of outsiders and local people. Salary of local people should be same as those coming from outside. The salary and the increment of the workers is very less. The employment reports should be given to the administration every 6 month or on yearly basis regarding the Jobs given to locals and other persons. Finally, there will be pollution when there will be expansion. Due to this people's health will be affected for which we need a hospital. More plantation is required not only inside the plant area but also in the surrounding area out of those 7 lakh trees to be planted. Company to see how the agriculture can improve in the area and see over all development of the people.
05	Smt Subasini Sahu, Barkerjang village
	She said they want the Jindal company should grow but the people should be given all benefits through CSR. She said, I have seen there has been improvement in the village condition since 2015. There has been improvement in the roads, electricity, water supply, teacher support in schools and common facilities. She

We have not received any road, power, water supply facility. There are people standing outside, loud speaker should be provided for them. We don't oppose the expansion.
07	Sri Kishor Roul, Badkerjang village
	He said, for the last 16 yrs Jindal steel has set up their plant by loosing our land. He said, our children have got job in the company in due to that. When expansion will be there more people will get employment. However there will be also more pollution from a 25 MTPA plant. So, He requested to take all necessary interventions to stop pollution by engaging good pollution control measure, plantation and protect the health of the people. He also mentioned that Barkerjang village is surrounded by the plant, therefore more development should be done by giving special status to this village.
08	Shri Man Mohan Sahoo, Village President, Barkerjang
	He said the state government and the Central Government is working towards solving the problem of unemployment. Only the industries can give more employment which will strengthen the backbone of the country. The Govt has already approved the project; no one can't stop the expansion so we also welcome the project. Has said he welcomes the project. All people in the local area including the non-land losers also should also be given permanent employment. The expansion will be there but the company should take scientific measures to control pollution. Special facilities should be given to the villagers of Barkerjang which is surrounded by the industry due to its geographical position.

He said the report has been done to reflect 10 Acts on Environment such as Air Act, water Act, Biological Diversity Act, Wild life protection Act. So the study has not been made as per these Acts. Then study has been done in 10 Km, but the ground truth is not reflected. but I want to say there is no crocodiles in the area, but it has been mentioned in the report, do you see crocodiles in your villages. He said, I am not against the expansion project of Jindal, I want that let there be expansion but within the Law. There are two companies one is the Jindal steel & Power Ltd for 6 MTPA Integrated Steel and other is Jindal Steel Odisha Ltd. He said that the land and forest land of both the company should be reflected in the report and its impact should be considered. He advised that EIA and EMP of both the companies to be reflected in the report. He also mentioned that as this is a large project the study of air, water, flora, fauna, bio-diversity should have been done covering three seasons. Due to any project there is development but it should not be at cost of environment. He said we feel proud that such a large integrated steel and cement plant. He mentioned that in the report that there is no mention of wildlife sanctuary and eco sensitive area in 10 km</p>

	<p>radius. Distance of Satkosia Wildlife sanctuary it should be checked from the boundary of the project. He also advised that the data regarding the numbers of species of trees, bamboo, climbers, grass, animals, reptiles, tortoise and fishes etc to be verified from recent studies as per his knowledge. The Rehabilitation and Resettlement should be done by R & R Act, 2013 and State Rules under this act not under 2006 policy of the State. He mentioned of road accident and mitigation plan in the report to prevent road accident. The measures proposed by the Jindal Steel for mitigation of pollution in the expansion project is very welcome. He said soil pollution to be mitigated as Angul is in the critically polluted area, so cumulative impact assessment should have been done. He said we welcome the expansion but proper management of pollution should be done He also stressed on the proper management of fly ash. The report to be corrected and the defects in the report to be reflected. Perfect data on tree, fishes and elephants should be reflected in the report. A chapter on compliance to the 10 Environment acts to be included. We welcome the project, but this has to be done with giving due respect to the right to live Article 21 given by our constitution.</p>
11	<p>Smt. Sunanda Das, Jarada village</p>
	<p>She said, I am not opposing the Jindal plant nor oppose the villagers. We the people of Angul district have welcomed the project 15 years back. We get our livelihood from the company, we all have benefitted from the company. We were in a bad shape in past but our economic condition has improved. We will get more benefit from the company. There will be pollution problem but we have supported the company as we have benefitted. We don't have any objection to the expansion of the project.</p>
12	<p>Sri Jintendra Kumar Sahoo, Ex President, Angul Bar Association.</p>
	<p>He said when the Jindal Plant was established in Angul in 2006, we had thought all will get benefitted and will get jobs. But after 15 yrs our people, son of the soil are going to outside for works. There is no development in Angul it shodw from the roads and the street lights of Angul. He said there is not officers in high possion from local area. All the land looser contractual workers should be made permanent in the existing Jindal Plant. Few people who have lost their land are beggars. He</p>

	He said, he is from Kaliakata village area. He said there should not be any discrimination of salary between the local persons and those coming from outside. We welcome the expansion project as it will generate lots of employment and businesses where our people will get benefited. He said industry as Jindal and NALCO is here but there is no medical college and demanded that there should be a medical college and super specialty hospital in Angul where all the people will benefited as there in rise in heart deceases in Angul area. He also requested for supply of good quality Mahanadi river water for Angul area for drinking purpose instead of Brahmani river water, which he said had requested Mr Naveen Jindal. He said we can't stop the company but we should stop environment issues. He also urged to do more of planation in this area and requested to provide more employment and good increment in salary to local people.
14	Sri Ramachandra Behera, Sarpanch, Nisha Gram Panchayat
	He said that Jindal steel has been established here with acquisition of land from people. People had cooperated with the company by giving their land with the hope that they will be getting employment and will get social and economic development. Many people have got employment and people's economic conditions have improved. With expansion of the plant it is hoped that more people will get employment and there will be still more development. He said employment should be given based on education and qualification. Apart from that employment should be given those who have lost their land as don't have any qualifications. Due to Jindal company in socio economic status has improved and we are sure there will be more development due to the expansion of the plant.


Observation:

The meeting was ended with thanks to the chair.




