

PROCEEDINGS OF THE PUBLIC HEARING MEETING HELD ON 26.10.2022 (AT 11.00 AM) AT KALYANA MANDAP MARJITAPUR VILLAGE FOR ENVIRONMENTAL CLEARANCE IN RESPECT OF MARJITAPUR SAND QUARRY ON RIVER BRAHMANI OVER AN AREA OF 5.058 HA. LOCATED IN VILLAGE MARJITAPUR, TEHSIL DHARMASALA IN THE DISTRICT OF JAJPUR, ODISHA

The public hearing in respect of the Marjitapur sand quarry on river Brahmani over an area of 5.058 Ha at village Marjitapur, Tehsil Dharmasala in Jajpur District was held on scheduled date & time in Marjitapur village with reference to EIA Notification S.O 1533 (E) Dtd. 14.09.2006 and amendments thereof.

The Panel consisted of the following members:

2. Sri Pramod Kumar Behera, Regional Officer, State Pollution Control Board, Odisha, Kalinganagar.

Sri Akshaya Kumar Mallick, Additional District Magistrate (Revenue), Jajpur, supervised & presided over the public hearing process and assisted by Sri Pramod Kumar Behera, Regional Officer, State Pollution Control Board, Kalinganagar, the representative of State Pollution Control Board, Bhubaneswar.

At the outset, welcoming the members participated in the meeting Sri Pramod Kumar Behera, Regional Officer, State Pollution Control Board, Kalinganagar, gave a brief introduction about the guidelines to be followed for the public hearing in the light of EIA Notification, 2006 and interim operational guidelines till date, in respect of Marjitapur sand quarry on river Brahmani over an area of 5.058 Ha at village Marjitapur, Dharmasala Tehsil in Jajpur District.

Welcoming the public, Sri Akshaya Kumar Mallick, Additional District Magistrate (Revenue), Jajpur explained that the views, comments, objections and opinions of the public are necessary while considering the environmental clearance of the project. He asked the project proponent to make a brief presentation before the public gathered in the meeting about the various aspect of the proposed project to be undertaken for better awareness of the public.


Project proponent, Sri Jayanta Kumar Jena addressed the dais and assembled public and introduced the proposed project. Sri Mrityunjaya Das, representative of M/s Kalyani Laboratories Private Limited, on behalf of the project proponent briefed the public on the mining proposal and Environmental impact of Marjitapur sand quarry during production of sand over an area of 5.058 Ha. He briefed the salient features of the proposed project, Environmental Management, Pollution control measures, afforestation programme, employment and various other peripheral development activities envisaged in the project.



Then, Sri Akshaya Kumar Mallick, Additional District Magistrate (Revenue), Jajpur, requested the public to give their views, comments and opinions on the proposed project.

The views expressed by various speakers on the proposed project are as follows:


1. Sri Bulu Behera, Raichanda
Sri B. Behera acknowledged that the mining project will benefit them and benefit many other construction-related Government and public work. He further reminded the public that they can get sand at economical rate by operation of the sand quarry and request the authority to give permission to the sand quarry.
2. Sri Devaprasad Samanta, Chausathipada
Sri D. Samanta greeted the dias & gathering and informed that no one has received the sand mine lease in Dharmasala electoral zones 11 and 12. Sri Samanta further explained the difficulty in completing government construction projects as well as residential development work for citizens due to non availability of sand. He requested the government to approve the proposed sand mining project. He further emphasized direct and indirect advantages to local people in terms of job creation and tax revenue to the Government from the sand mining.
3. Sri Bipin sethy, Talajanga
Sri B. Sethy greeted the dias and expressed concern on unavailability of sand quarry in the nearby area and requested the administration to give permission to the proposed sand quarry.
4. Sri Udayabhabu Sahu, Kabatabandha
Sri U. Sahu greeted the panel and expressed his support for the proposed sand quarry project. He reminded that the sand quarry should run for improvement of lives of common people in the local area.
5. Sri Sabash Mallick, Marjitapur
Sri S. Mallick talked about the difficulties he faced when transporting sand from sand quarry located far away from the local area.
6. Sri Khirod Samanta, Marjitapur
Sri K. Samanta greeted everyone present in the meeting and demanded that permission be granted for operation of the sand quarry.
7. Sri Ashok Samanta, Marjitapur
Sri A. Samanta greeted the dias and informed that common people will be benefited from the sand quarry operation. He further told that availability of sand in the nearby locality will help people with resident construction and completion of other pending construction work.
8. Sri Kirti Samanta, Marjitapur
Sri K. Samanta greeted the panel & gathering and welcomed the sand quarry project and hoped for employment generation in the proposed sand quarry project.



9. Sri Gauranga Rana, Marjitapur
Sri G. Rana expressed his concern on not being able to purchase sand at a reasonable rate and requested to give permission to the proposed Sand Quarry.
10. Sri Sanjay Singh, Marjitapur
Sri S. Singh expressed his concern on not being able to finish home construction due to non availability of sand and requested to give permission to the sand quarry project.
11. Sri Suman Singh, Marjitapur
Sri Singh expressed his support to the proposed sand quarry project.
12. Sri Biswajit Biswal, Marjitapur
Sri Biswal requested the Administration to give permission for operation of the sand quarry.
13. Sri Ajay Mohanty, Marjitapur
Sri A. Mohanty requested the Authority to give permission for operation of the proposed sand quarry.
14. Sri Rabindra Sethy, Marjitapur
Sri R. Sethy requested the Administration to give permission for operation of the sand quarry.
15. Sri Nilamani Sethy, Marjitapur
Sri Sethy complaint on non employment of local public and non engagement of local vehicle due to non operation of the sand quarry. He supported the project and requested the Government to give permission to the proposed sand quarry.
16. Sri Ranjan Ku. Tarai, Marjitapur
Sri R.K.Tarai greeted everyone and informed the necessity of sand in government and private construction project work. He expressed his grievance on non employment due to non operation of stone quarries, sand quarry, stone crushers etc. He expressed his concern on economy of sand while purchasing from outside the leases and requested the administration to give permission for operation of the sand quarry.
17. Sri Pabana Rana, Chausathipada
Sri P. Rana requested the Administration to give permission for operation of the sand quarry.
18. Sri Deepak ku. Das, Jenaur
Sri D.K.Das greeted the dias and informed that since there isn't a sand quarry in the local area, allowing the sand quarry will benefit the local village construction and development activities.
19. Sri Kuna Barik, Natilo
Sri K. Barik requested to give permission for operation of the sand quarry.
20. Sri Suryakanta Senapati, Chausathipada
Sri S. Senapati requested the Authority to give permission for operation of the sand quarry so that local people will be benefitted.



21. Sri Hemanta Ku. Jena, Chausathipada
Sri H.K. Jena greeted everyone and expressed importance of sand i.e. raising the river holding capacity, Tax collection and utilisation in villager development projects etc. He requested the Authority to give permission to the proposed sand quarry project.
22. Sri Prahallad Barik, Natila Chausathipada
Sri P. Barik greeted the dias & gathering. He was hopeful that local people will be engaged and get employment opportunity in the sand quarry. He further expressed his opinion that there won't be any environmental effects from the sand quarry project.
23. Sri Prasant Nayak, Kushnpur
Sri P. Nayak greeted dias and gathering, expressed his view that environment will not be affected by operation of the sand quarry. He demanded plantation at the sand quarry lease boundary and hoped for local people employment and engagement in the proposed sand quarry operation.
24. Sri Subhashis Mohanty, Kushnpur
Sri S. Mohanty greeted dias and expressed his concern towards the pending Govt. Development projects due to non availability of sand in the local area. Sri Mohanty told that there won't be any environmental effects by the sand mining project and requested plantation of trees at sand quarry lease boundary. Sri Mohanty supported the sand mining project.
25. Sri Kirtan Bihari Sahoo, Sathuapatana
Sri K.B. Sahoo greeted the dias & gathering and expressed his concern over the Brahmani River Bridge's condition, road condition and hospital facility in the area. Sri Sahoo demanded development of Brahmani River Bridge, rehabilitation of low lying area public, school development, development of a veterinary hospital facility in the local area etc. He requested the Authority to give permission to the proposed sand quarry project.
26. Sri Dillip Ku. Mallick, Dandaharpur
Sri D.K Mallick greeted the dias and complaint traffic congestion and life lost due to truck movement, Children's safety concerns when travelling on the road, accident due to overloading of transporting vehicles, congested and narrow road in the area for truck movement. He demanded improvement of road condition. Sri Mallick urged the public to take proper decision or be ready to face the consequential affect during the sand quarry operation. He further complaint on non carrying out plantation activity by the earlier lessee of the proposed sand quarry.
27. Mrs Parbati Bal, Marjitapur
Smt. P. Bal had no objection with the proposed sand quarry however expressed her concern for children's safety on the road during plying of sand transporting vehicles.



28. Sri Ganeswar Sahoo, Sathupatana
Sri G. Sahoo referenced previous events with fatalities and road damage brought by sand mining. He opposed the sand quarry mining project.
29. Sri Taranisen Sahoo, Marjitapur
Sri T. Sahoo complaint of not getting benefit as per the commitments made by the District Administration earlier. He requested the Administration to take appropriate decision on operation or grant of permission to the proposed sand quarry.
30. Sri Ratnakar Swain, Sathuapatana
Sri R. Swain opposed the proposed sand quarry and expressed his concern for the safety of schoolchildren passing the road during sand quarry operation.
31. Sri Sunil Ku. Saho, Marjitapur
Sri S.K. Saho complaint on road quality degradation due to sand mining project and requested the Administration to take appropriate decision.
32. Sri Manas Ku. Jena, Belagadia
Sri M.K. Jena greeted panel & gathering and told that the over exploitation of the sand will result in flooding. He placed emphasis on creating jobs for the local residents and expressed his concern over the sand pile up on the road caused by truck transport during sand quarry operation. He expressed his view that sand quarry operation should not be started if creating local issue in the area.
33. Sri Sribasya Panda, Chausathipada
Sri S. Panda greeted the gathering and requested the authority to give permission for the sand quarry since it would improve livelihood and give jobs to the poor.
34. Sri Pradipta ku. Das, Marjitapur
Sri P.K. Das opposed the proposed sand quarry.
35. Sri Makarana Rana, Natilo
Sri M. Rana greeted the dias and gathering, expressed his concern for the people safety as well as the safety of school and college going students using the road, dust pollution, traffic and damage road etc.
36. Sri Bijay Ku. Das, Marjitapur
Sri B.K.Das greeted dias and gathering and informed that the general public are not getting any benefit from the sand quarry and reminded that his local GP people will agitate if the Sand Quarry is given permission.
37. Sri Gopinath Swain, Sathuapatana
Sri G. Swainhad opposed the proposed sand quarry.
38. Sri Manguli Mallick, Sathuapatana
Sri M. Mallick opposed the proposed sand quarry.
39. Sri Kalpataru Nayak, Sorni
Sri K. Nayak greeted the panel and complaint the road condition in the local area. He opposed the proposed sand quarry project.

40. Sri Pabitra Tarai, Marjitapur

Sri P. Tarai greeted everyone and opposed the sand quarry. He complaint on the bad road condition and traffic congestion due to vehicular movement of the sand transporting vehicles.

41. Sri Krupasandhu Padhan, Sathuapatana

Sri K. Pradhan opposed the proposed sand quarry.

42. Mrs Rajani Mallick, Sathuapatana

Smt. R. Mallick opposed the sand quarry and raised the concern of river bank erosion and cited a previous incident in the sand mine which caused fatality.

43. Sri Ramachandra Behera, Madhusudanpur

Sri R. Behera expressed the importance of sand in construction activity. Sri Behera complaint on non plantation activity by the earlier lessee. He requested the administration to give permission to the sand quarry.


44. Sri Alok Nayak, Madhusudanpur

Sri A. Nayak opposed the sand quarry project and complaint that school and college are located nearby the lease area. He further informed that local people are facing accident issue due to truck movement in the area.

45. Sri Pradeep ku. Sahoo, Sathuapatana


Sri P. K. Sahoo informed that they are affected by the road dust pollution, sand piled up road & causing accident etc. He suggested that smaller capacity vehicles be given preference for transportation.

The Panel has received 251 numbers of written representations during the hearing. Sri Akshaya Kumar Mallick, Additional District Magistrate (Revenue), Jajpur asked the project proponent to present their comments to the people with respect to the demands raised by the public in the public hearing meeting. Sri Mrityunjaya Das, representative of M/s Kalyani Laboratories Private Limited on behalf of the project proponent, made the commitment on the issues raised by the public. The statements of issues and concern of the public with comments of the applicant prepared in English & Odia language are annexed separately. The meeting was ended with tanks to the chair.

Road dust and sand pile up on the road 	<p>Sri Mrityunjaya Das, representative of M/s Kalyani Laboratories Private Limited on behalf of the project proponent, made commitment to certain issues raised by the public are as follows:</p> <p>Plantation of Jamun, Mango, Chakunda, tamarind, Kadam, Neem, Bel etc. tree shall be undertaken in both sides of Road connecting to the lease area, river bank, Village waste land.</p> <p>The utmost precaution will be taken to avoid overloading.</p> <p>For reducing the traffic and safety of the public, an alternative route will be used for the passage of vehicles carrying sand from the Sand Lease Area to the National Highway after taking into consideration of normal passage of public.</p> <p>For the trucks and tractors that are the main contributors of road network pollution, dust suppression measures such water spraying would be done at a particular interval.</p> <p>As declared by the State and central government, mining regulations will be obeyed. In addition, the advice and recommendations of environmental consultant will be applied to ensure a balance between sand mining and environmental regulation, as committed.</p>



NOTICE

It is brought to the notice of all concerned that Shri Jayanta Jena has proposed to have Environmental Assessment for Maritapur Sand Quarry over an area of 5.058 Ha in village Maritapur under Dhammasala Tehsil of Jajpur district to obtain Environmental Clearance from State Environment Impact Assessment Authority (SEIAA), Odisha. The proposal has applied to the State Pollution Control Board, Odisha, Bhubaneswar for a Public Hearing.

By virtue of Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change, Government of India Notification No. SO 153 (E) Dtd. 14.09.2016, the Board has been authorized to conduct environmental public hearing and to consider such invited suggestions, views, comments and objections on matters relating to environmental aspects of the proposed project from all the persons including beneficiary, residents, environmental groups and others located at the proposed site / sites of disbenefit / sites likely to be affected.

- To the above purpose, the Board will only hear:
- A. Any person who is likely to be benefited by the grant of Environmental Clearance.
 - B. Any person who owns the land over the project with respect to which an application has been submitted for environmental clearance.
 - C. Any association of persons whether incorporated or likely to be benefited by the project and/or functioning in the field of environment.
 - D. Any local authority within any part of whose local limits is within the vicinity to or wherein the project is proposed to be located.

Persons as above who desire to submit their views, comments, objections etc. relevant to the project, may do so in writing within 30 days from the date of publication of this notice addressed the same to the Member Secretary, State Pollution Control Board, Odisha through Registered Post.
