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PROCEEDINGS OF THE PUBLIC HEARING FOR GRANT OF ENVIRONMENTAL CLEARANCE FOR THE PROPOSED DUMANGDIRI STONE QUARRY-III OVER AN AREA OF 20.364 HA, BEARING KHATA NO. 72, PLOT NO 262 IN VILLAGE DUMANGDIRI UNDER PANPOSH TAHSIL OF SUNDERGARH DISTRICT DISTRICT HELD ON 07.11.2022 AT 11 AM AT DUMANGDIRI PLAYGROUND, DUMANGDIRI VILLAGE UNDER PANPOSH TAHASIL OF SUNDARGARH DISTRICT

The public hearing for grant of Environmental Clearance for the proposed Dumangdiri Stone Quarry-III over an area of 20.364 ha, bearing khata no. 72, plot no 262 in village Dumangdiri under Panposh Tahsil of Sundergarh District was held on 07.11.2022 at 11am at Dumangdiri playground, Dumangdiri village under Panposh Tahasil of Sundargarh District. Sri Abhimanyu Majhi, Sub-Collector, Panposh supervised and presided over the public hearing Process. Dr. Binod Bihari Dash, Senior Environmental Scientist and Regional Officer, State Pollution Control Board, Odisha, Rourkela delivered welcome address, organized and conducted the public hearing meeting in association with District Administration.

The Public Hearing in respect of the above proposed Dumangdiri Stone Quarry-III was held as per the schedule and the venue decided by the District Administration in accordance with the EIA Notification S.O.1533 (E) dated 14.09.2006 and subsequent amendment therein. The State Pollution Control Board, Odisha, Bhubaneswar had advertised in newspaper in Odia daily- Dharitri on dtd. 29.09.2022 and in English daily- The Times of India on dtd.29.09.2022 regarding announcement of public hearing venue, date and timing. The Public Hearing meeting with regards to date, place and time was announced in public address system apart from its publication in local dailies. The attendance sheet of the public attended the public hearing is annexed as Annexure - I. Around 108 persons had attended the public hearing meeting where as 42 persons had delivered their views whose list is annexed as Annexure II. One written representation was received during public hearing which is annexed as Annexure-III

At the outset, Dr. Binod Bihari Dash, Senior Environmental Scientist and Regional Officer, State Pollution Control Board, Odisha, Rourkela welcomed the officials and the public presented in the meeting. He briefly described the objectives and procedure followed for conducting the Public Hearing as per the EIA Notification S.O.1533 (E) dated 14.09.2006 of Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change (MoEF & CC), Govt. of India. He also explained about the importance of such public hearing for the proposed Dumangdiri Stone


Quarry-III over an area of 20.364 Ha for grant of Environmental Clearance and also invited views, comments, objections & opinions of the public which are necessary while considering the Environmental Clearance of the project and he also told that those who want to give their written statement about the proposed projects, they can do so during the public hearing process. He requested Sub Divisional Magistrate, Panposh to preside over the meeting.

Welcoming the public, the officials, Press Media, Police Officers and the assembled public in the meeting, Sri Abhimanyu Majhi, Sub Divisional Magistrate, Panposh, briefly explained the about the purpose of the public hearing about the proposed Dumangdiri stone quarry-III over an area of 20.364 Ha, bearing khata no. 72, plot no 262 in village Dumangdiri under Panposh Tahsil of Sundergarh District. He also described the importance of environmental impact studies carried out for the proposed Stone quarry and the views, comments, objections and opinions of the public which are necessary while considering the Environmental Clearance of the project. He told that the project proponent will present the summary of environmental impact studies for the proposed project for the knowledge of the Public. He invited the villagers to present their views, opinions & objections about the proposed project on environmental consideration. He also told that the public can also submit written representations. The proceeding along with video recording of the meeting will be forwarded to the SEIAA for further decision-making process for grant of Environmental Clearance. He requested the Regional Officer, SPCB, Odisha, Rourkela to carry out further proceeding of the meeting.

Regional Officer, SPCB, Odisha, Rourkela requested the representative of Project Proponent of proposed proposed Dumangdiri stone quarry to make a brief presentation before the public gathered in the meeting about the details of Environmental Impact Assessment report of the proposed project in a simple summarized manner for better understanding of the Public.

On behalf of the Project Proponent Tahsildar, Panposh welcomed the official members, public and all other participants and gave a brief description about Dumangdiri Stone Quarry-III. He expressed the details of proposed project which are given as follows:

- The Dumangdiri Stone Quarry-III is located at Villages-Dumangdiri, Tehsil- Panposh. State Environment Impact Assessment Authority, (SEIAA) Odisha, has issued a Letter No. 4593/ SEIAA dated 19.05.2022 for proposal for ToR of Dumangdiri Stone Quarry-III over an area of 50.32 acres or 20.364 hectares bearing Khata No. 72, Plot No.262 in village- Dumangdiri, Tahsil- Panposh, District- Sundargarh. The proposed stone quarry measuring 20.364 hectares will be leased for a period of 5 years from the date of execution of the lease. The new proposed quarry located in Dumangdiri Village of Panposh Tahasil, District-

Project Proponent

Sundargarh has proposed total production of 50018 cubic meter rock mass for a period of 5 years.

- As there is no forest land involved in the proposed lease area, so forest clearance is not required.
- Various programs for environmental management and development will be adopted if the proposed quarry becomes operational. Excavation of rock mass will be worked out by Open cast method of mining. Handling of rock mass will be done both manually and by excavator. Loosening of rock mass will be done by drilling and blasting. Haulage and Transport for road metal & mineral and waste/overburden will be transported through tipper and tractor.
- Only small dia holes will be drilled only by jack hammer using light charges will be followed. No heavy blasting is required. The nearest habitation is beyond 1.0 Km away from the lease area. Vehicles are to be covered with tarpaulin during transportation from source to destination to avoid air pollution. The boundary marks and pillars are to be maintained to keep in good condition. No quarry operations will be carried out within the safety zone area, which has been considered 7.5 m wide all along the lease boundary. Mining activities will be carried out with appropriate environment safeguard and shall take such steps for reclamation whenever necessary. The mining operation will be stopped when it touches the Ground water table and same will be informed to the appropriate authorities. If hill slopes are encountered, proper maintenance and safeguards must be ensured so as to prevent erosion or landslides.


Then Regional Officer, SPCB, Rourkela invited the public to register their names to put forth their views, suggestion, comments and objections on matters relating to environmental aspects of the project. Then the public deliberated on various issues one by one which are as follows

1. Sri Gandura Oram, Ex-PS Member, Dumangdiri GP

Sri Oram greeted & welcomed the members, gathered public and all other participants to the meeting. He told that elders are going far ways to earn livelihood and after opening of project livelihood can be earn in the locality.

2. Sri Ignace Baa ,Village-Dumangdiri

Sri Baa greeted & welcomed the members, gathered public and all other participants to the meeting. He told that tribal people are surviving on the local forest. They are feeding on the flower and leaves of different forest species like Kusum, Sal, Chanr.

There forefather have shown the path to conserve the forest land. They should be provided with healthy environment. He opposed the project. The project proponent are not showing their liability towards proving job for a definite tenure. People are suffering due to air pollution. He After the excavation period overs there land will remain infertile.

3. Smt Roylen Bud , Village- Dumangdiri

Smt Bud greeted & welcomed the officials, gathered public and all other participants to the meeting. She opposed the project for apprehension about the degradation of land, air and water, health degradation of domestic animals. During the blasting & blow of debris the walls are damaged. People are getting threatening. They are not getting reply of the complaint filed to the higher authority.

4. Smt .Magdali Lamga, Village- Dumangdiri

Smt. Lamga told that during to the construction of road the waste materials are dumped to the paddy field so that the land degrades. Due to the felling of trees & bushes domestic animals are not able get grazing land. Due to mining activities we are facing water scarcity. So they oppose the project.

5. Sri Samra Ekka , Word Member, Word No-3, Dumangdiri

Sri Ekka greeted & welcomed the officials, gathered public and all other participants to the meeting. Those who were going far way for search of livelihood, they will get job opportunity nearby if the project resumes. He supported the project.

6. Sri Temba Ekka , Village- Dumangdiri

Sri Ekka told that local youth are not getting income source here. People are facing mishaps far away. If govt is proposing project here, it's a good news for them . They can earn livelihood here.

7. Smt Ashrita Ekka, Village- Dumangdiri

Smt Ekka supported the project. The previous speaker who stated about the threatening the villagers by authority is false. The quarry should resume here.

8. Sri Dhanika Ekka, Village-Dumangdiri

Sri Ekka told that they have been working in quarry since there childhood days, so the quarry should resume there . The previous speaker who stated about the threatening the villagers by authority is false.

9. Sri Bidya Bhansa, Village- Dumangdiri

Sri Bhansa told that roads are damaged due to movement of vehicles. The authority did not fulfil there promises. The debris generated by the blasting hits the walls and domestic animals. So he opposed the project.

10. Sri Chunia Ekka, Village- Dumangdiri

Sri Ekka told that the elderly people no more able to cultivate there land. There youth will get job if quarry resumes its activities.

11. Smt Jaymasi Lomga, Ward Member, Ward No-2, Village- Dumangdiri

Smt Lomga greeted & welcomed the officials, gathered public and all other participants to the meeting. She stated that domestic animals are facing problem due to mining activities. He opposed the project.

12. Smt Laudhi Toppo, Village- Dumangdiri

Smt Toppo stated that the vehicle are passing across our lands and they don't face any problem with this regard. So they are not opposing the project.

13. Smt Friska Kerketa, Village- Dumangdiri

Smt Kerketa stated that her home is adjacent to the proposed quarry. The road is going to pass across her personal property. But she is not interest to give away her property. So she opposed the project.

14. Smt Puspa Bhainsa, Village- Dumangdiri

Smt Bhainsa stated that huge lump of rock fell down in my home during the blasting which might have kill her Children. No steps had been taken from the company. So she opposed the project.

15. Smt Filsita Lakoda, Village- Dumangdiri


Smt Lakoda stated that blasting may damage life and property. So she opposed the project.

16. Smt Limus Lomga, Village- Dumangdiri

Smt Lomga stated that if they surrender all our land to govt for auction, where our domestic animal will graze. If the project withdraws domestic animal will get feeding and we are dependent upon them. So they opposed the project.

17. Sri Kishor Oram, Village- Dumangdiri

Sri Oram Stated that Kalunga is far away from here, so they are unable to go there for work. So if the quarry resumes its operation they can get job opportunity here. He supported the project.

18. Sri Jhadia Ekka , Village- Dumangdiri
Sri Ekka stated that Kalunga and few other regions are full of industry. Despite the industrial pollution they are able to cultivate there. Then why cannot they do here . He supported the project.
19. Smt Jasnita Lomga, Village- Dumangdiri
Smt Lomga stated that the previous quarry operators didn't paid wages regularly. Due the blasting livestock are damaged. Quarry authority did not respond even after the complaint. She opposed the project.
20. Sri Juspın Kido, Village- Dumangdiri
Sri Kido proposed quarry is adjacent to my home. The demarcated area crosses behind my home. So he opposed the project.
21. Sri Biswakarma Ekka, Village- Dumangdiri
Sri Ekka stated that if quarry resumes youth will get job opportunity. He supported the project.
22. Sri Jhuba Ekka, Village- Dumangdiri
Sri Ekka greeted & welcomed the officials, gathered public and all other participants to the meeting. He stated that the illiterate person will get some benefit from the project. So he supported the project.
23. Sri Fagu Ekka, Village- Dumangdiri
Sri Ekka stated that if quarry resume local youth will get job opportunity. So he supported the project.
24. Sri Luhuru Ekka, Village- Dumangdiri
Sri Ekka greeted & welcomed the members, gathered public and all other participants to the meeting. He stated that people who go outside for job are misguided. If quarry resume local youth will get job opportunity. So he support the project.
25. Smt Bahalen Lomga, Village- Dumangdiri
Smt Lomga stated that the quarry authority has not paid her due. So she opposed the project.
26. Sri Jems Lomga, Village- Dumangdiri
Sri Lomga stated that the quarry authority took away my paddy land without my consent. So he opposed the project.
27. Smt Sebestiani Kindo, Village- Dumangdiri
Smt Kindo stated that very less number of people of a particular village will get job opportunity if quarry resume. People of nearby village will not get opportunity. So she opposed the project.

28. Smt Bahalen Logun, Village- Dumangdiri
Smt Logun opposed the project.
29. Smt Magdali Kerketa, Village- Dumangdiri
Smt Kerketa stated that the company authority did not fulfil there promise to provide job to her husband. So, she opposed the project.
30. Sri Clement Lugun, Village- Dumangdiri
Sri Lugun stated that his paddy land is adjacent to the quarry. So he is facing problem. They can maintain their livelihood from forest. So there is no need of quarry.
31. Smt Premsula Tete, Village- Dumangdiri
Smt Tete requested the authority to take care about their grievances. The dug out area of the quarry is still not filled up, which is dangerous for the wild animals. The authority has not paid the remaining due. She opposed the project.
32. Sri Roshan Tete, Village- Dumangdiri
Sri Tete said that the debris flow due the excavation activities are dangerous for habitat. The ground water level is decreasing which hampers the agricultural activities.
33. Sri Gulsan Lugun, Village- Dumangdiri
Sri Lugun told that the quarry activities are going on since my childhood days. We are facing air pollution, degradation of forest, scarcity of grazing land, problem in cultivation and transportation since then.
34. Sri Ashith Baa, Village- Dumangdiri
Sri Baa stated that now they became educated, so they will conserve their forest land. We can get job elsewhere based on our educational qualification. So they oppose the project.
35. Smt Champa Oram, Village- Dumangdiri
Smt Oram Stated that there is no industry nearby , so people are going far way in search of livelihood . If the quarry start operating, they will get income source nearby. He supported the project.
36. Sri Sunet Ekka, Village- Dumangdiri
Sri Ekka said that those who are opposing the project, will they provide the income source to all. There is no need to go far away for income. If the quarry starts operation, they can get job opportunity here. He supported the project.

37. Sri Anmol Lomga, Village- Dumangdiri

Sri Lomga said that the site where the quarry is proposed, once upon a time that was there paddy land where his father used to do cultivation. The plant nearby were fell down without permission. There were some instances of injuries due to blow of debris. He raised a question that who will take responsibility of the land if they degrade. He opposed the project.

38. Smt Basanti Ekka, Village- Dumangdiri

Smt Ekka stated that people are going far away for income. They leave home in early morning and return in late evening, so they unable to take care of family. If quarry start operation they will get income nearby. She supported the project.

39. Smt Sumitra Ekka, Village- Dumangdiri

Smt Ekka told that those who oppose the project, even they cannot protect the forest. So its better to permit the quarry for its operation. She supported the project.

40. Sri Sujit Lomga, Village- Dumangdiri


Sri Lomga greeted & welcomed the members, gathered public and all other participants to the meeting. They don't want to sell the land which is preserved by our forefathers. If quarry start its operation people will face numerous problems like air pollution, breathing problems. So he opposed the project.


41. Sri Sanatan Lugun, Village- Dumangdiri

Sri Lugun told that habitats are lies near the quarry, so people are facing air pollution. Vibration generating due to blasting causes crack in mud huts and pucca houses. Due to loss of vegetation the quality of air degrades. He opposed the project.

42. Smt Karmi Ekka, Village- Dumangdiri

Smt Ekka told that they have been protecting the forest area since last 5 years. Those who are opposing the project have never taken the responsibility of protecting the forest. Rather they are selling minor forest produces. She supported the project.




