

PROCEEDINGS OF THE PUBLIC HEARING OF MANTRAJHOLLA STONE QUARRY- IV, V, VI, VII (CLUSTER) UNDER CLUSTER APPROACH FOR PRODUCTION OF 15,929 CUM / ANNUM OF STONE OVER AN AREA OF 5.665 HA IN MOUZA MANTRAJHOLLA, RAYAGADA TAHASIL IN THE DISTRICT OF RAYAGADA HELD ON 04.03.2023 AT 11.00 A.M. IN MANTRAJHOLLA VILLAGE, KULI GRAM PANCHAYAT, MALIGAM R.I. CIRCLE UNDER RAYAGADA TAHSIL OF RAYAGADA DISTRICT

The public hearing in respect of the above project was held on **04.03.2023** as per the schedule and at the venue in accordance with the EIA Notification S. O. 1533 (E) dt. 14.09.2006. The public hearing with regard to date, place and time was announced in Public Address System at Mantrajholla village, Kuli Grampanchayat under Rayagada Tahsil area of proposed project site and also published in Daily News Paper. The process followed for public hearing was adequate.

Sri Hemendra Nath Nayak, Regional Officer, State Pollution Control Board, Rayagada welcomed the public to the hearing and briefed about the objectives, process & procedures followed for conducting such public hearing.

Sri Somanath Pradhan, OAS (S), Additional District Magistrate, Rayagada highlighted on importance of such hearing & presided over the public hearing.

Sri Amaresh Rath, Environmental consultant (P&M Solution) on behalf of Mantrajholla Stone Quarry- IV, V, VI, VII (Cluster) has explained about the proposed project and briefed about the Pollution Control measures to be adopted in the Project.

The following is the summary of the public hearing proceedings, reflecting all the views and concerns expressed by the assembled public at the venue. It was recorded by the officials of the Regional Office, State Pollution Control Board, Odisha, Rayagada.

1. Smt Asanti Saraka, Mantrajholla

Smt Saraka told that if the stone quarry project will come up in their area, then it will be good for them and there will be scope of local employment in the mining project.

2. Smt Salai Mandangi, Mantrajholla

Smt Mandangi repeated the same views of Smt Saraka and said that if the stone mining project will come up in their area, then they will be get benefitted and there will be scope of local employment in the said mining project.

3. Sri Simadri Mandangi, Mantrajholla

Sri Mandangi welcomed the public & the dias. He introduced himself as a villager of Mantrajholla. He highlighted the following benefits that they got from the stone quarry in their area, such as: their local people get employed in different fields as driving jobs, in

drilling jobs and also in excavation jobs in the mining area. He expressed that if the stone quarry project will come up in their area, then it will be good & beneficial for them.

4. Sri Glasi Kadraka, Mantrajholla

Sri Kadraka welcomed the public & the dias. He introduced himself as a villager of Mantrajholla. He questioned the authority about neglecting local villagers on different jobs and employment in the stone quarry as driver, Drilling technician, metal cutting jobs, labourer etc. He also highlighted the adverse impact of stone mining on agriculture and nearby nallah/streams in their nearby areas.

5. Sri Hakina Himirika, Mantrajholla

Sri Himirika told that most of the villagers in their village are poor and they need job in their locality for their livelihood. He expressed that if the stone quarry project will come up in their area, then it will be good & beneficial for them and there will be scope of local employment in the said mining project.

6. Sri Samarao Himirika, Mantrajholla

Sri Himirika welcomed the public & the dias. He introduced himself as a Diploma Holder & a student of B. Tech and questioned the authority about neglecting local villagers on different jobs and employment in the stone quarry as supervisor, driver, Drilling jobs, metal cutting jobs, labourer etc. He also highlighted the adverse impact of stone mining on agriculture and nearby nallah/streams in their nearby areas. He demanded upon the peripheral development of their village through mutual discussion of local sarpanch, samiti members with the authority.

7. Ms. Chanchala Mandangi, Mantrajholla

Ms. Mandangi welcomed the public & the dias. She introduced herself as a villager of Mantrajholla. She told that due to existence of stone quarry in their locality, they are getting benefitted in terms of local employment for the livelihood and subsequently helping in terms of their children's school education from the money income from stone quarry otherwise they have no option to go outside the state in searching of job. She expressed her happiness that if the stone quarry project will come up in their area, then it will be good & beneficial for them.

8. Smt Lalita Palaka, Mantrajholla

Smt Palaka said that most of the villagers in their village are poor and they need job in their locality for their livelihood. She expressed that if the stone quarry project will come up in their area, then it will be good & beneficial for them and there will be scope of local employment in the said mining project.

9. Smt Sunita Mandangi, Mantrajholla

Smt Mandangi said that if the stone quarry project will not come up in their area, then they will face lot of problem. She told that most of the villagers in their village are poor and they need job in their locality for their livelihood. She expressed that due to stone quarry, there will be scope of local employment in the said mining project.

10. Sri Gangana Hepruka, Utkapati

Sri Hepruka welcomed the public & the dias. He introduced himself as a local tribal of the area and questioned the authority about neglecting local villagers on different jobs and employment in the stone quarry. He expressed his displeasure with placing his views in tribal language.

11. Smt Hemalata Tadingi, Mantrajholla

Smt Tadingi welcomed the public & the dias. She introduced herself as a villager of Mantrajholla and told about the various consequences due to operationalization of stone quarries near to their village. She told that if stone quarries will be operationalized then they will face a lot of problem like vibrational impact in the surrounding nearby village area (i.e. developing of cracks in the walls of their village houses due to vibration) due to blasting in the quarries, windborne dust problem created in the agricultural fields as well as in the village area due to quarry activities and also effect on the nearby Kandula cropping which is the livelihood for tribal. She also highlighted the adverse impact of stone mining on human health due to dust pollution and on nearby nallah/streams and water problem in their nearby areas.

12. Ms. Kuni Himirika, Mantrajholla

Ms. Himirika welcomed the public & the dias. She introduced herself as a villager of Mantrajholla. She told that due to existence of stone quarry in their locality, they are getting benefitted in terms of local employment for the livelihood and subsequently helping in terms of their children's school education from the money income from stone quarry otherwise they have no option to go outside the state in searching of job. She expressed her happiness that if the stone quarry project will come up in their area, then it will be good & beneficial for them.

13. Sri Gangadhar Mandangi, Mantrajholla

Sri Mandangi welcomed the public & the dias. He introduced himself as a local villager of the area and highlighted on different issues like dust pollution, local employment in the stone quarry and peripheral development. He told that they are not opposing the stone quarry, but quarry project should come up with proper solution of aforesaid issues.



14. Sri Venkata Mandangi, Mantrajholla

Sri Mandangi welcomed the public & the dias. He introduced himself as a local villager of the area and told that if the stone quarry project will come up in their area, then it will be good & beneficial for them.

15. Sri Subash Kadraka, Mantrajholla

Sri Kadraka welcomed the public & the dias. He introduced himself as a villager of Mantrajholla and told about the various consequences due to operationalization of stone quarries near to their village. He told that if stone quarries will be operationalized then they will face a lot of problem like vibrational impact in the surrounding nearby village area (i.e. developing of cracks in the walls of their village houses due to vibration) due to blasting in the quarries and also highlighted the adverse impact of stone mining on nearby nallah/streams and water problem in their nearby areas. He also questioned the authority about neglecting local villagers on different jobs and employment in the stone quarry.

16. Sri Gopal Mandangi, Mantrajholla

Sri Mandangi said that most of the villagers in their village are poor and they need job in their locality for their livelihood and survival. He expressed that if the stone quarry project will come up in their area, then it will be good & beneficial for them and there will be scope of local employment in the said mining project.

17. Sri Subarao Mandangi, Mantrajholla

Sri Mandangi repeated the same as said by the previous speakers and told that most of the villagers in their village are poor and they need job in their locality for their livelihood and survival. He expressed that if the stone quarry project will come up in their area, then it will be good & beneficial for them and there will be scope of local employment in the said mining project.

18. Sri Labanya Kadraka, Mantrajholla

Sri Kadraka welcomed the public & the dias. He introduced himself as a villager of Mantrajholla and told about the advantages & dis-advantages of stone quarry mining in their area and various consequences due to operationalization of stone quarries near to their village. He told that if stone quarries will be operationalized then they will face a lot of problem like vibrational impact in the surrounding nearby village area (i.e. developing of cracks in the walls of their village houses due to vibration) due to blasting in the quarries and also highlighted the adverse impact of stone mining on nature, forest, agricultural fields & nearby nallah/streams (i.e. scarcity of water problem) in their nearby areas. He also questioned the authority about neglecting local villagers on different jobs and employment in the stone quarry. He demanded for local employment in the stone quarry mining project.

19. Sri Shyama Saraka, Mantrajholla



He expressed that if the stone quarry project will come up in their area, then it will be good & beneficial for them and there will be scope of local employment in the said mining project. Sri Somanath Pradhan, OAS (S), Additional District Magistrate, Rayagada has given concluding remarks on the hearing and elaborated the process to be followed for submission of the proceeding to the SEIAA, Bhubaneswar for further action. He extended thanks to the public participated in the hearing and for offering their views, suggestions and objections.



Sl. No.	Issues raised by the public in Hearing Meeting	Response of the Project Proponent
01	Regarding Vibrational impact due to drilling and blasting	Controlled blasting as per Govt Guideline will be practiced in the mine to control vibrations and flying fragments. To avoid the dust generation from the drilling operations, wet drilling method will be adopted.
02	Regarding Noise Impact	All precaution will be taken to reduce generation of noise. Ear protectors or earplugs will be given to persons working in higher noise level area or on machines & steps will be taken to improve the maintenance of all equipment's so that the noise level will remain within permissible limits. Plantation of trees will also be carried out on internal roads and barriers to reduce impact of noise.
03	Regarding Impacts on agriculture	Mitigative measures such as regular water sprinkling on active areas i.e. haul roads; dump sites shall be strictly followed so that impact will be minimized.
04	Regarding Impact of dust on the environment	Proper water sprinkling shall be carried out at the mine site as well as on transportation road for dust suppression. The mineral will be transported by road through covered trucks/tippers to reduce the fugitive emission caused by the wind. Speed of the vehicles will be maintained within the prescribed limits. Development of Green belt/plantation within mining lease along haul roads to arrest dust.
05	Protection of Environment	Stone mining will be done in such a way that it will not affect the environment.
06	Protection of Water Bodies/ Nallah/ Streams	Stone mining will be done in such a way that it will not affect any nearby natural water streams.
07	Peripheral development of the village	Peripheral development of the village will be done as per Government Guideline in consultation with Local Sarapanch.
08	Regarding Plantation	Plantation will be done as per the scheme of mining plan.
09	Regarding Employment	Local villagers will be given preference for engagement in the mining project.
