

PROCEEDINGS OF THE PUBLIC HEARING OF JILLING LANGALOTA IRON ORE MINE [456.037 HA (AS PER DGPS)/465.100 HA (AS PER ROR)] OF M/S. ODISHA MINING CORPORATION LTD. FOR TOTAL EXCAVATION OF 17.4385 MILLION TPA [SALEABLE IRON ORE-7.7723 MILLION TPA, MINERAL REJECTS-2.2276 MILLION TPA, WASTE- 7.4385 MILLION TPA, TOPSOIL- NIL] ALONG WITH EXISTING: 5 NOS. WITH TOTAL CAPACITY- 1400 TPH (STATIONARY CRUSHING UNIT), 2X300 TPH, 2X200 TPH, 1X400 TPH EXISTING: 3 NOS. WITH TOTAL CAPACITY- 150 TPH (MOBILE SCREENING UNIT), 1X150 TPH MOBILE SCREENING PLANT, 1X50 TPH STATIONARY SCREENING PLANT, 1X100 TPH MOBILE SCREENING PLANT, NEW: 10 NOS. The public hearing in respect of the above project was held on 09.05.2023 as per the schedule and at the venue in accordance with the EIA Notification S. O. 1533 (E) dt. 14.09.2006. The public hearing with regard to date, place and time was announced in Public Address System in nearby villages of proposed project site and also published in Daily News Paper. The process followed for public hearing was adequate.

Er P Kar, Regional Officer, State Pollution Control Board, Keonjhar welcomed the public to the hearing and briefed about the objectives, process & procedures followed for conducting such public hearing.

Sri Jadumani Mahala, OAS(SAG), Additional District Magistrate (Revenue), Keonjhar presided over and supervised the public hearing. He briefed about the importance and objectives of such hearing and invited the project proponent to highlight on proposed project.

Sri Abanikanta Pradhan, Regional Manager of the mine explained about the proposed project and briefed about the Pollution Control measures to be adopted in the mine.

The following is the summary of the public hearing proceedings, reflecting all the views and concerns expressed by the assembled public at the venue. It was recorded by the officials of the Regional Office, State Pollution Control Board, Odisha, Keonjhar.

1. Sri Bendeep Soreng, Jalahari

Sri Soreng while supporting the public hearing stated that villagers were facing many inconveniences, but at present few developmental jobs have been taken up by M/s.OMC Company like setting up DAV school and Adarsh Bidyalaya. Further, he stated that since the person of this area depends upon Mines, OMC should ensure providing employment to the local villagers so that poor people of this area can manage their livelihood. With regard to drinking water facilities, he stated that though the drinking water facility is being provided here by the Government, but it is not sufficient. The company is supplying water through tanker to few areas. He requested the OMC management to arrange for drinking water through bore well by either electricity or solar system. Further, he stated that due to accumulation of garbage in this area since very long time, villagers are suffering from different diseases. He told that the clinic provided by M/s.OMC is not enough for treatment of the patients. Hence, he requested for providing pathological test facilities and Ambulance facilities for shifting serious patients for better treatment. Lastly, he requested OMC to provide necessary support to promote sports activities for the youths.

2. Sri Kanhu Charan Samal, Vice President, KMFU Union, Jurudi

Sri Samal while supporting the public hearing stated that earlier around more than 2500 people were working in Jilling Langalota Mines with M/s.Essel Mining Industries Ltd. Presently from three panchayat around more than 1000 people are working in M/s.OMC Ltd. and when production of OMC will enhance, definitely the employment will be generated, and local people will get employment. The profit earned from this mine will be spent for developmental jobs of this area. He requested for employment to villagers. He also said that the existing hospital of OMC is having only 2 beds, which should be increased to 5 beds. Further he requested that one ITI should be set up in this locality so that after necessary training, the students will be eligible for employment as Driver, Mechanic, Electrician and Fitter.

3. Sri Naresh Kumar Das, Jalahari Basti

Sri Das while supporting the public hearing stated that OMC is operating this mines since last two years and during this period OMC has initiated steps to improve education system, health care etc. Further, he stated that if OMC is granted permission for expansion, definitely pollution will increase and due to air pollution people are suffering with tuberculosis and skin disease, hence, he requested to take appropriate pollution control measures as per govt. guidelines. During rainy season, the runoff water from the mines containing slurry enters to their agricultural land thereby destroying the land. This problem should be looked into by the OMC Company. Further he stated that there is a perennial stream in Jalahari and Jurudihi panchayat and the residents of these two panchayats are depending upon that stream. Several times the villagers have discussed for its restoration and rejuvenation with District Administration and OMC Management. Hence, he requested for restoration of this perennial stream.

4. Sri Chandra Mohan Barik, Banspani

Sri Barik expressed his emotions by stating that due to blasting operation in Apahatu mines, the residents of Behera hutting are suffering a lot and requested for controlled blasting and due to running of Plant, dust generation is increasing. At the same time, he appreciates that as committed by M/s.OMC Ltd. around 400 employments will be there after expansion of the Mines. He told they were total 80 persons working in the old company. When the company closed its operations, they were told that the new company will keep them in the job. But it is a matter of regret that even after one and half years have passed, no employment has been given to them. He also told that they have no ration card and control card. Therefore, he requested to reinstate the old employees in the same designation and same salary.

5. Sri Ankura Karwa, Jajang

Sri Karwa while supporting the public hearing stated that M/s.OMC Ltd. is operating here since last 2 years. During this period, the Company has taken up many developmental jobs like providing Adarsh School at Barbil, School at Koira, bus facilities for college students, medical facilities etc. He said during this two years, few villagers have got employment in OMC and also requested for further employment.

6. Smt. Basanti Patra, Jalahari

Smt. Basanti while supporting the public hearing expressed that earlier the villagers were working and maintaining their livelihood smoothly. But present days are very difficult for the villagers. The old company retrenched them before their retirement, though in their place, their wards got employment, but they were also retrenched when the company closed its operation. Now the company of Govt. of Odisha has come and will enhance its production, hence they want that the villagers who worked in previous company should get employment in OMC Ltd. Regarding vehicle movement inside their villages, huge dust generation is there. Company should take measures to minimize the dust generation and drinking water to be supplied to all villages. Admission facilities to be introduced in the OMC hospital and Ambulance should be provided to the patients.

7. Smt. Nagini Munda, Jalahari G.P

Smt. Nagini while supporting the public hearing expressed that due to expansion Project, the villagers will definitely get benefited. Many developmental jobs have been taken up by the Company. School and Playground has been provided by the Company. Recently Dalki Nala has been cleaned by the company authority. She requested, on priority basis, local people should be given employment. She further requested for necessary help to SHG group.

8. Smt. Sabita Das, SAG Member, Jalahari

Smt Das while supporting the public hearing stated that since last 2years OMC is operating its mines in this locality. She told that OMC has taken necessary steps for education and health care facility and requested the Company for plantation in the open space.

9. Smt. Janamani Munda, Jalahari


Smt. Munda while supporting the public hearing informed that Company has provided school bus and drinking water supply. She further requested for employment.

10. Sri Nirakar Patra, Jalahari

Sri Patra while supporting the public hearing told during last two years, more than 50% people have been given employment by the Company and for better education, one Adarsh School has been set up at Barbil by the company wherein through entrance students have been admitted in the school. The classes will start after the summer vacation this year. He further told that OMC management has given commitment for 450 employments after the expansion of Mines.

11. Smt. Bhagyashree Das, Jajang Panchayat

Smt. Bhagyashree while supporting the public hearing told that since 40 years M/s. ESSEL Mining Ltd. was operating over here and M/s.OMC is working here since last 2years. During this 2years period of time around 1000-1200 employment has been given by the OMC Company and also training has been arranged for the ladies in ITI. Arrangement has been done for the poor and scholar students to take admission in Adarsh School. Further Company has associated with the villagers during Raja festival celebration, Swachhata Pakwada campaign and on many other cultural functions. Few months back, one football tournament has been organized by the OMC to promote sports activities among the youths of this locality. She requested OMC to provide one



mini stadium so that sports man will be able to do their practice there. She also requested for providing employment as per the education of the youths. Further she requested that for poor and widow women skill development course like Stitching, Beauty Parlourcourse to be arranged. OMC has already provided medical facilities but during the time of ESSEL Mining specialist doctors like Paediatric, Gynaecologist, Dentist and pathological test were available. But now in the OMC medical, no specialist doctors are available. Hence requested to provide specialist doctor like gynaecologist, Medicine specialist, Dentist and paediatric etc. Further, she requested for beautification of Gurubeda Picnic spot, so that this place will be famous as a tourist place.

12. Smt. Lalita Singh, Jurudi

Smt. Singh while supporting the public hearing demanded for opening of +2 classes in DAV and extend free education to poor students. There is acute problem of drinking water in Jayshyam Basti, earlier a bore well was there during the period of ESSEL Mining, but now the power connection for boring has been disconnected, hence requested the mine for supplying drinking water.

13. Smt. Budhuni Patra, Jalahari

Smt. Patra while supporting the public hearing stated that M/s.OMC Ltd. has provided them School, Bus for school children, Medical and free medicines, etc. Further, she requested for a boat for stream(Dalki) situated in their area and also development of a park which will be used for amusement purpose and renovation/repairing of Ganesh Temple in Jalahari panchayat.

14. Smt. Binodini Patra, Jalahari


Smt. Binodini while supporting the public hearing requested for employment to the villagers of surrounding area as per their qualification. Due to heavy dust generation, people are facing health problem, hence medical facility needs to be provided to them.

15. Smt. Parbati Patra, Jalahari

Smt. Patra while supporting the public hearing requested OMC Company to solve the unemployment problem.

16. Sri Pranab Mohanty, Jurudi

Sri Mohanty expressed his concern that in view of increase of production, dust generation will be more and traffic problem will arise for which he requested the OMC Company as well as DistrictAdministration to take care of it. The roads are becoming muddy due to water sprinkling, hence traveling on that road is very difficult. Hence he requested to use modern technology of dust suppression like vacuum rather than water sprinkling. Like JSW, OMC also should use vacuum machine to soak the dust from the roads. Land losers are frequently approaching the OMC authority for employment, but till date no solution have been found out, hence priority should be given to the land losers for employment. Increasing the number of students in the existing DAV school is not possible, so he requested for shifting the DAV school to other suitable place so that more and more students can be accommodated for admission. It may be noted that from this area students are getting NEET and Engineering also. Due to enhancement of production, the movement of truck in the mines road will increase as a result the dust



generation will be more, hence requested for regular water sprinkling and massive plantation to be done for dust suppression. One playground to be made to promote sports and games activities for the youths. Earlier two numbers of mines were operating here but due to closure of mining operation, the villagers are going to other states for earning living their family members alone in the village. A survey should be done to find out the exact numbers of persons went to outside state for job. Due to unemployment, theft cases are increasing in the area. For setting up crusher, screen plant, M/s.OMC Ltd. should give priority to local crusher and screen plant owner, which will facilitate employment for the local people. If the screen plant and crushers are brought from the outside agency, it will be very much difficult to approach the outside agency by the villagers. For any future employment vacancy notification, Panchayat office should be contacted and local people should be given priority for employment. Due to blasting operation, bore wells are getting damaged and water flow layer is being diverted. As told by previous speaker, the perennial stream to be renovated and one park to be developed at Gurubeda to make it a tourist place.

17. Smt. Rajani Penthei, PS Member, Jurudi Panchayat


Smt. Penthei while supporting the expansion expressed that the residents of this area are very poor and hence employment should be given to them. Priority for employment should be given to land losers. Further she demanded for bus facility for school children, medical facilities and drinking water facility.

18. Sri Achan Munda, Bholabeda

Sri Munda expressed that there is a forest which is surrounded by 6 numbers of villages like Khuntpani, Banspani, Jajang and Jalahari etc. OMC is conducting his mining activities in 6 numbers of plot on that forest area. Therefore, he demanded for employment to the villagers.

19. Dr. Niladri Bihari Mishra, President, Paribesh SurakshyaSamiti, Joda

Dr. Mishra while supporting the public hearing stated that now the country is running through global economic wherein the Mining Industries have major role which has brought the people from dark to light. Now the OMC Company has applied for its expansion project. He stated that he is acquainted very well with this place. In between the number of labour have increased in this area and not only mining activities but also other activities also increased. During the time of Janaki Ballav Pattnaik, the budget of Odisha was Rs.6,000 Crores but now the budget has increased to Rs.2,00,000 Crore. with mineral fund budget, a new medical college, advance trauma centre has been opened and further a university will also be opened in Keonjhar district. During 2004, they demanded State Govt to provide lease of all the mines of this area to M/s. OMC and transportation to be given to MMTC. During the year 1987, he found a stream here which was working as lifeline of the people of this area. Hence requested the OMC Company for its proper maintenance. Due to bad water drinking water supply here, the people of this area generally suffers with Dental problem, skin diseases and stomach problem etc., Hence requested OMC company to provide drinking water facilities in all the Anganbadi centres and schools of this area. During mining scam period, dust generation was more in this area. Now a days, this has been reduced to around 50%. So, he requested the authority to identify the points of dust generation and dust suppression should be done by using dust sucker machine, by massive plantation and by regular sprinkling of water. Further he suggested to form a committee to look into the issues of this locality.



20. Smt. Subta Triya, Jajang Panchayat

Smt. Subta Triya expressed that there is no facility of drinking water supply and Electricity in her village. Earlier Essel Mining Industries Ltd. was providing drinking water, electricity etc. But M/s.OMC Ltd. disconnected their electricity connection. Further, OMC is not providing employment to her sons for which they are facing difficulties.

21. Smt. Bharati Naik, Langalota

Smt. Naik in her address expressed that the residents of Langalota are facing multiple difficulties like people are starving due to unemployment and scarcity of water. He demanded employment for one person from each family. Lastly, she supported the public hearing.

22. Sri Kishore Chandra Sahoo, Jurudi


Sri Sahoo expressed his happiness for the public hearing being conducted by M/s. OMC Ltd. He stated that the facilities which people of their area were getting when M/s. Essel Mining and M/s. Rungta Mines were existing now they are deprived of getting not even 1% of those facilities by OMC. Further he told that the local people are compelled to migrate to other places due and in search of jobs then what is the benefit of having mines in in their area. He demanded Government of Odisha for giving utmost attention for local employment. He demanded for providing streetlight at both sides of the road from Essel Mining to Hatapada. He demanded for water supply as they are facing difficulties to bring water from a nearby nallah. He appealed all present to give a memorandum of demand to Government of Odisha for development of the Adivasi people of their area. In his address he informed that students from local Jajang area are not getting admission in Jajang DAV School even though they have voter card and Aadhar card, whereas outsiders are getting admission. So, he demanded OMC Management to give utmost priority for giving admission of local students in DAV School. At the end he requested for overall development of the local people, so that OMC will develop.

23. Sri Sunia Naik, JagangBasti

Sri Naik in his address informed that frequent change of ownership of mines have taken place during these years but till not even a single person has been given employment in this mine. Land of about 70 to 80 Acre has got degraded due to mining dust still to their utter dismay not a single person has got employment. He opposed the public hearing.

24. Sri Chittaranjan Naik, Jajang Basti

Sri Naik in his address to the audience told that since his childhood he has observed that his father was working as a labour but deprived of a job. They become tired of supporting the multiple mining owners. In spite of extending support there is no job for them. They have submitted documents several times to the OMC authorities but still no job for the local people. Nobody has visited their Jajang area for assessment of their necessities. As this is being a government enterprise but nothing has been given to them. The perennial nallah has filled with soil. Due to land degradation the farming land become unfertile and unfit for cultivation. Due to dust, they are suffering from stomach disorders etc. Still, they have not been compensated by providing employment and in absence of employment how they will manage their livelihood. So, he demanded job local people then only they will support the proposed project.



25. Smt. Rita Rani Patra, Jajang

Smt. Rita Rani while supporting the public hearing informed that there are 14 Anganwadi Centre in Jalahari, Jagang and Juruli Panchyets. All the Anganwadi centers are in dilapidated condition. Some buildings have developed cracks, some do not have water facility, no bed for check-up of pregnant women. She requested to the OMC Authority to arrange for bed for pregnant women, Table & Chair, water facility, kits for the small children. Provision of boundary wall for all the Anganwadi centre. She demanded basic facilities for the small children of Anganwadi Centre, utensils for food, water filter, electricity, fan and provide all the facilities required for the small children. Moreover, she requested water facility for gardening so that they can grow vegetable at their Anganwadi garden. She requested to do Aadhar for the dropout students because in absence of Aadhar they are deprived of taking admission in the school. She requested to give training to the SHG Women to get independent.

26. Sri Rama Penthei, Ex-PS Member, Jurudi Panchayat

Sri Penthei while supporting the public hearing requested to provide employment to the land losers of 3 Panchyets. He demanded to provide employment to local people as all required educated technical skilled persons are available in their area.

27. Sri Bijoy Mahakud, Jurudi

Sri Mahakud in his address informed that due to expansion from 6.0 MTPA to 10.0 MTPA the mines reserve will be exhausted very soon. He failed to understand already huge quantity of material is piled up why the company will do expansion as the mines life is very short. He told that there is no hope of any job for the local because very soon the ore of the mines will exhaust. He is fortunate that OMC is operating many nearby mines not the corporate organization. So, he is hopeful that OMC will do many developmental jobs for the local people in coming days. Further he requested to rejuvenate the Jalahari Nalla by desilting and distribute water to the panchyets area after purification. He requested to set up one park and plantation needs to be done around the Jalahari Nalla for common people. He requested to do rejuvenation work of Thakurani Nalla which is situated in between Jurudi to Jajang, establish one school from class VI to XII for quality education of the children of poor people so that they need not to depend upon the mines, one 200 bedded hi-tech hospital within 25 KM radius, Renovation of Lord Ganesha Temple at New Colony, Park facility and picnic spot at Tindharia Temple, Avenue plantation from Banspani to Palaspanga road so that pollution can be controlled. Lastly with regard to safety concern, he requested OMC authority to give utmost attention before giving fitness to the vehicle plying in the mines. He demanded for a cremation ground for Jurudi people. Village Street light should be inspected and if required new lights to be fitted for all the villages.

28. Smt. Subasho Patra, Jalahari Basti

Smt. Patra while supporting the public hearing requested for toilets at Dalkai basti and separate bathing ghat for ladies and gents, Park, de-siltation of the local nalla, provision of street light and one priest for the temple. Lastly, she requested to provide employment to the local people.

29. Smt. Dahsama Munda, Langalota

Smt. Munda while supporting the public hearing requested to give employment to the unemployed new generation in place of old employees.



30. Sri Bikash Khatua, Banspani

Sri Khatua while supporting the public hearing said he was grateful for the development job done by OMC during their very small tenure. Due to the efforts of OMC one English medium

school could be established for the children middle class and poor people for their higher study. About medical facility, in Banspani one medical has already been established. As a result, poor people are happy because they are getting free medical and medicines. With respect to education, the contribution of OMC is great, because in Barbil OMC has established one Adarsha Vidyalaya in which 25 students have been selected to study over there from Class-I to Class-X free of cost, an ITI has been established at Koida. He persuaded all present to plant trees jointly hand in hand so that pollution can be controlled. He requested OMC to make one mini stadium at Banspani for the local children to expose their hidden talent and also requested for road connectivity etc.

31. Sri Jiten Munda, Gurubeda

Sri Munda while supporting the public hearing demanded for a school bus for the student upto Jagang because at their village there is one school upto class-V and the student beyond class V are going to school at Jajangon foot. He demanded for teachers because there is shortage of teacher in their village school. There is only 2 teachers for 100 students. He requested to repair the existing sintex overhead water tank, to provide water tanker at their village. He requested to restore the old pathway which their ancestors used at Jilling which is at present closed by the OMC and not allowing anybody to cross. They are compelled to use indirect way through Gurubeda or Pandiya Chaowk which is unsafe and long distance.

32. Sri Suresh Chandra Patra, Jalahari


Sri Patra while supporting the public hearing is happy that OMC has always provided all the facilities which they required like education facility, medical facility etc. OMC has been extending facilities under CSR always. After expansion everybody will be benefitted. OMC has established one ITI at Koida for providing technical education and one Adarsh School at Barbil. He requested OMC to establish at least one 100 bedded hospital which will be helpful for local people for getting instant medical treatment and adequate time to send the serious patient for specialist treatment. He also requested to provide one ambulance. In Jalahari Panchyat there is no high school, so he requested Hon'ble ADM for one high school.

33. Smt. Priyanka Majhi, Sarpanch, Jajang

Smt. Majhi gave her consent for the project. She said she is hopeful that OMC will continue to provide facilities in future also. She requested to provide employment for skilled and unskilled both.

34. Smt. Subhakanti Soy, Sarpanch, Jurudi

Smt. Subhakanti supported the public hearing. OMC has taken several steps with respect to education, health and many other and she expects in future also OMC will continue to do so. OMC has opened one ITI and one Adarsha Vidyalaya in which students from this area can get admission. With respect to medical emergency, she requested to provide one 24 hours helpline number which should be displayed everywhere so that in one call the ambulance can reach



anywhere in 3 panchyets. Further, she requested to give instruction to the contractor for providing employment to the local people according to their qualifications. She also requested OMC should give attention for streetlight, drinking water, road etc.

35. Smt. Sambari Naik, Ward Member, Ward No. 3, Jagang GP

Smt. Naik while supporting the public hearing requested to provide facilities in her Ward No.3 which they are lacking. She requested repair of existing boring for water which has got damaged now and for repair of road. She requested to do controlled blasting.

36. Smt.Preeti Samal, Jalahari

Smt. Preeti while supporting the public hearing expected that OMC will fulfil the expectations of all the three panchyats. OMC has provided water facility, education facility school bus to them. In new colony there is no toilet, hence she requested to provide the same. She requested to do the needful to so that there should not be deposition of slurry on the approach road towards new colony during rainy season. She requested for water sprinkling at Apahatuto control dust because due to movement heavy vehicles round the clock there is profuse dust generation and this dust settles on drinking water, foodstuffs. Due to inhale of the dust they will fell ill. Lastly, he requested to remove one huge dry tree to avoid accident.


37. Sri Hiroraj Karua, Jurudi Panchyat

Sri Karua while supporting the public hearing requested to provide medical facility and education facility, employment. He requested to arrange for all the demands which his previous speakers has placed in his address. Due to movement of heavy tippers life of their children are at stake. So, he requested to give attention to all the aspects for their better life.

38. Sri Narendra Munda, Sarpanch, Jalahari

Sri Munda while supporting the public hearing demanded the following:

- i) One 100 bedded hospital because for any medical emergency people of their locality depends upon Keonjhar or Joda. In case of any eventualities and medical emergencies people will get instant treatment.
- ii) He is satisfied that OMC Authority are always in touch with them for any developmental activities. They have given in writing for providing road, water, education, electrification and many other. According to OMC processing of developmental jobs remains late as this a government organization. So, he requested to speed up the process for taking up all the developmental jobs.
- iii) He requested to take up steps to make the SHG Group women self-dependent so that they can mange livelihood of their families.
- iv) Some bore well was set up by M/s. Essel Mining Industries Ltd which are not working due to non-payment of electricity bill. He requested OMC to again make these bore wells functional.
- v) He requested OMC to make all the streetlights in Panchyat roads functional after repairing through solar panel or electricity.
- vi) Post expansion there will be huge movement of tippers, as a result, there is possibility of road jam. In this regard, he requested OMC Authority to arrange for parking lot of heavy vehicles.
- vii) He demanded for Community toilet in his Panchyat.



- viii) Provide Dust bin to all the villages of different panchyat to make this place tidy and clean.
- ix) He requested to depute specialist doctors for different diseases.
- x) He requested to provide Ambulance services 24 hours.

39. Sri Dusmanta Patra, Jajang

Sri Patra while supporting the public hearing requested to provide toilet, supply electricity and water supply.
