

PROCEEDINGS OF THE PUBLIC HEARING OF LASERDA-PACHERI MANGANESE AND IRON ORE MINES OF M/S. TRIVENI EARTHMOVERS (P) LTD FOR WITH PRODUCTION CAPACITY OF IRON ORE: 1.545 MTPA (ROM) WASTE: 1.182 MTPA (TOTAL EXCAVATION: 2.728 MTPA) AND MANGANESE ORE: 0.110 MTPA (ROM), WASTE: 0.355 MTPA (TOTAL EXCAVATION: 0.465 MTPA) ALONG WITH DRY SCREENING AND CRUSHING UNITS OF 2X200 TPH PRIMARY CRUSHING, 2X200 TPH SECONDARY CRUSHING, 2X200 TPH TERTIARY CRUSHING, 2X250 TPH VIBRATING SCREEN AND 1X150 TPH VIBRATING SCREENING PLANTS WITHIN TE MINING LEASE AREA OF 131.800 HA IN VILLAGES DHANURJAYPUR, KANARDA AND LASERDA HELD ON 04.07.2023 AT 11.0 AM AT MOUZA DHANURJAYPUR (KHATA NO. 122, PLOT NO. 4/1238, PROPOSED AREA AC. 3990 DEC UNDER BARBIL TAHASIL OF KEONJHAR DISTRICT.

The public hearing in respect of the above project was held on 04.07.2023 as per the schedule and at the venue in accordance with the EIA Notification S. O. 1533 (E) dt. 14.09.2006. The public hearing with regard to date, place and time was announced in Public Address System in nearby villages of proposed project site and also published in Daily News Paper. The process followed for public hearing was adequate.

Er P Kar, Regional Officer, State Pollution Control Board, Keonjhar welcomed the public to the hearing and briefed about the objectives, process & procedures followed for conducting such public hearing.

Sri Jadumani Mahala, OAS (S), Additional District Magistrate (Revenue), Keonjhar presided over and supervised the public hearing. He briefed about the importance and objectives of such hearing and invited the project proponent to highlight on proposed project.

Sri Pralayananda Behera, Sr. General Manager of the mine explained about the proposed project and briefed about the Pollution Control measures to be adopted in the mine.

The following is the summary of the public hearing proceedings, reflecting all the views and concerns expressed by the assembled public at the venue. It was recorded by the officials of the Regional Office, State Pollution Control Board, Odisha, Keonjhar.

1. Sri Muga Munda, Sarpanch, Bolani G.P, Odisha

Sri Munda raised some demands for which he requested the company to fulfil it. They are as follows:

- a) The mine shall carry out peripheral development works in its surrounding villages as well as the land losers needs to be given employment and proper compensation.
- b) Developmental jobs like providing drinking water, development of roads, lights, education, infrastructure development etc. for the villages who have participated in the public hearing.
- c) The unemployed youths of 10 nos. villages of their Panchyat needs to be given technical training and provide permanent employment in the mine as per the recommendation of Bolani Sarpanch.
- d) Government Schools of Bolani Panchyat needs to be renovated and provision for adequate teachers to be there. Provisions of Bus to be made for the college and school students who travels from distant places.
- e) A committee of 14 members need to be formed under the chairmanship of Bolani Sarpanch for awarding transportation job of the minerals to the local people.
- f) Renovation of old temples of the villages.
- g) Ambulance needs to be provided to the villagers for going to District Headquarter Hospital.
- h) Loader, Proclain, JCP, Bolero etc. as required by the mine will be deployed by the recommendation of Sarpanch.
- i) Compensatory afforestation by planting 2 plants for destruction of 1 tree.

2. Sri Sarat Chandra Khilar, Dhanurjapur, Bolani, Odisha

Sri Khilar expressed his happiness for the proposed mines. At the same time, he expressed his concern for the surrounding villagers who will be certainly affected due to mining activities, be it noise pollution, dust pollution, degradation of agriculture etc. They will be in trouble if company will not manage the aforesaid issues in a well-planned and organized way. He stated that there is acute shortage of teachers in the existing schools; hence he requested the management to provide appropriate teachers. He requested to establish and manage one Sishu Mandir school for the small children. He demanded permanent employment for the local people as per their educational qualifications or by imparting technical training to them. He requested the SHGs to organize themselves and inform all the issues of villages to the company which need to be resolved by the company hand in hand with SHG. He also requested the company to choose one educated person from every village and form a committee so that the committee will look after various issues of the villages. He said that due to mining activities certainly the local people who are managing their livelihood by selling the forest products will be badly affected. Hence, he requested proper rehabilitation of those people. He requested to give support to the religious and cultural festivals which are observed in mass so that this will help in eradicating superstitions and enhance their standard of living. Simultaneously, he said that if the mine will extend helping hand to the villagers then definitely the villagers will support the mine which will ultimately lead to development of that area.

3. Smt. Parvati Kiro, Sarpanch, Kiriburu West, Jharkhand

Smt. Parvati while supporting the public hearing expressed her happiness that after a long time a mine is going to open in their area because in past various companies were operating mines over there and due to closure of those mines the people are in great trouble and have become unemployed. Due to unemployment in their locality the youth masses are compelled to migrate outside. She appealed the company to provide employment to the unemployed youth after providing technical training. She also showed her concern towards the environmental impact that will take due to mining activities. She stated that company has assured to take appropriate measures like improving water table, reduce air pollution by tree plantation etc. So, she requested the mines to give utmost attention on environmental issues and further requested to look into health, education, development of women etc.

4. Smt. Suman Mundu, Naib Sarpanch, Kiriburu West, Jharkhand

Smt. Mundu while supporting the public hearing said that she is hopeful that after opening of the proposed mines people will get facilities like education, employment, medical etc. She requested to open a Drug Addiction Rehabilitation Centre (Nasha Mukti Kendra) because many youths of their locality are under the influence of this. If the youths will get rid of this then only there will be development in the society.

5. Sri Kartikeswar Khilar, Dhanurjapur, Bolani G.P, Odisha

Sri Khilar while supporting the public hearing expressed his happiness for commencement of the proposed mines. He said that in Bolani Panchyat area not a single mine is operational and due to unemployment, the youths are getting misguided. People are managing their livelihood with great difficulties. So, people will be benefitted by opening of this mine. He raised some demands to the company for the surrounding villages. They are as follows :

- a) Employment to the local youths of surrounding villages of mines according to their qualifications.
- b) Priority to be given to the local for Transportation of mineral.

- c) Compensation and rehabilitation to the land losers.
- d) Priority to villagers for engaging their machineries and tools in the mine.
- e) Permanent employment to be provided to labourer.
- f) Medical facilities to villagers.
- g) Construction of schools and provide teachers to each school
- h) Supply of Drinking water.
- i) Support in the local religious festivals.
- j) Importance needs to be given for communication facilities of villagers.
- k) Provision of School Bus up to Barbil for ITI and college students.

6. Dr.Naladri Bihari Mishra, President, Paribesh Surakhshya Samiti, Joda, Odisha

Dr. Mishra stated that according to the executive summery placed by the company it indicates that there will minimum possibility of noise Pollution, air pollution & water pollution. The Thriveni Company is not new to this area. This company has done so many developmental jobs like roads, health support and various other jobs. The company has done one two storied Adivasi Vikash Samity building on the nearby roadside. He informed that they have not received any complaint about environment pollution about the company so far. By opening of this mine the people will get employment, education facilities, communication facilities etc. He supported the public hearing.

7. Sri Anjan Kumar Dash, Priest, Jagannath Mandir, Bolani, Odisha

Sri Dash supported the public hearing and hope the mine will provide employment to all.

8. Sri Shankar Kumar Rout, Kiriburu Hilltop, Boliani G.P, Odisha

Sri Rout while supporting the public hearing emphasized for employment as there is acute employment crisis. He said that everybody is happy that the mines will open and they will get employment.

9. Sri Krushna Chandra Behera, Laserda, Odisha

Sri Behera while supporting the public hearing said he is hopeful that the misery of the people will disappear once this mine opens. He demanded for provisions of drinking water, education, permanent employment to the youths as per their qualifications. But he opposed the system of conducting every work basing on the recommendation of Sarpanch.

10. Smt.Sunita Munda, Kiriburu Hilltop, Bolani G.P, Odisha


Smt. Munda expressed her discontent that the people of Kiriburu hilltop are always ignored while providing employment. Not only men are unemployed, but women are also unemployed. SHGs are not getting any help. So she demanded employment for unemployed women of Kiriburu Hilltop area. Though many girls have completed ITI training but still they are not getting job and already crossed the age limit. So, she requested the company to give a thought for the aged, educated and uneducated women of their area.

11. Sri Mansingh Munda, Ward Member, Koloponduri, Bolani G.P, Odisha

Sri Munda while supporting the public hearing said he is hopeful that by opening of the mine everybody will be benefitted.

12. Sri Binod Kumar Mahakud, Laserda, Odisha

Sri Mahakud while supporting the public hearing expressed his happiness. He is hopeful that by



opening of this mine expectation of everybody will be fulfilled. He requested the company to fulfill the expectations of the local people which should not go futile. They are the residents of Laserda Talasahi which is in very close proximity to the proposed mine. He kept some demands on behalf of the villagers which are as follows :-

- a) Employment
- b) Medical facility
- c) Ambulance facility
- d) Drinking water facility
- e) Repairing of the village road
- f) Mineral Transportation provision to villagers
- g) Bus service for the school children
- h) Teachers for the schools
- i) Streetlight
- j) Construction of one Sankirtan Mandali in village
- k) Repairing of the village temple
- l) Financial support to the village local religious festivals
- m) Old age pension
- n) Financial support to the poor students for higher studies
- o) One community Centre at Laserda Mouza.

13. Smt. Ahalya Behera, Kiriburu Base Camp, Odisha

Smt. Behera while supporting the public hearing stated that everybody of the area is landless. So, she requested for employment to all as per their qualifications. She also requested the company not to neglect them.

14. Smt. Rita Hembram, Kiriburu Base Camp, Odisha

Smt. Hembram while supporting the public hearing hoped that everybody will be benefitted once the mine opens.

15. Smt. Jhuli Apat, Koloponduri, Bolani G.P, Odisha

Smt. Apat demanded for all sorts of facilities as there is no school, no road and no drinking water facilities in their area. At the end she requested M/s. Triveni Earthmovers to provide all sorts of facilities to the villagers for which they will remain happy.

16. Smt. Saibani Mahakud, Koloponduri, Bolani G.P, Odisha

Smt. Mahakud expressed her discontent that there is no road, no school, no school bus, no employment in their area. So she demanded for employment, road, drinking water etc.

17. Smt. Bimala Barik, Ward Member, Ward No.12, Laserda, Odisha

Smt. Barik while supporting the public hearing demanded for employment and education.

18. Smt. Rohini Munda, Ex-Ward Member, Laserda, Odisha

Smt. Munda while supporting the public hearing demanded to fulfill all the assurances given by the company in the Gram Sabha. She requested to provide permanent employment to the land losers.



19. Smt. Jharana Bhuyan, Kiriburu Hilltop, Odisha

Smt. Jharana while supporting the public hearing informed that other than Kiriburu there are no mines in their locality. Hence, people are compelled to migrate outside in search of job. So, she requested to open the mines as soon as possible and give employment.

20. Smt. Rebati Naik, Kanarda, Odisha

Smt. Naik supported the public hearing. She expressed her grievances against the existing Sarpanch.

21. Smt. Meena Munda, Harmath, Odisha

Smt. Munda while supporting the public hearing demanded that the villagers who have lost their land to the company has some demands in written that should be signed by the company as a proof of written agreement between the company and land losers. She requested to fulfill all the demands which they have in writing.

22. Smt. Sukhadevi Naik, Bolani Basti, Odisha

Smt. Naik while supporting the public hearing stated that everybody will be benefitted by opening of this mine.

23. Sri Sashikanta Khillar, Zilla Parishad, Zone-26, Bolani G.P, Odisha

Sri Khillar while supporting the public hearing stated that they all are dependent upon Kiriburu mines and a small plant SSAB. So, there is acute shortage of job and job aspirants are more. So, he requested all to welcome Thriveni so that they can get employment.

24. Smt. Sujni Naik, Ward-16, Bolani Basti, Odisha

Smt. Sujni while supporting the public hearing demanded employment for all local people as per their qualifications and employment for land losers. He said that priority should be given to the local people for employment.

25. Smt. Meena Munda, Bolani Basti, Odisha

Smt. Meena supported the public hearing and requested to provide job to all.

26. Sri Birendra Khillar, Dhanurjaypur, Harmath, Odisha

Sri Khillar welcomed M/s.Triveni for opening the mines. He demanded for all round development like road, education etc.

27. Sri Madhusudan Apat, Laserda, Odisha

Sri Apat while supporting the public hearing requested for employment, drinking water, medical facility for their village people.

28. Sri Nilambara Apat, Laserda, Odisha

Sri Apat while supporting the public hearing requested to provide employment to the villagers.

29. Smt. Malati Khatua, Joda Vice-Chairman, Odisha

Smt. Khatua supported the public hearing.

Sri Sethi fully supported the public hearing and requested the participants to speak only about environmental issues so that everybody can get time to place their opinion.

32. Sri Ramesh Chandra Munda, Dhanurjaypur, Odisha

Sri Munda while supporting the public hearing stated that the local Adivasi poor people should be given employment and M/s.Thriveni Company should not ignore them from providing employment.

33. Sri Durjyadhan Barik, Koloponduri, Odisha

Sri Barik while supporting the public hearing, stated that people of this locality are facing lot of problem for their livelihood, hence requested the company to provide employment.

34. Sri Abhiram Munda, Pacheri, Odisha

Sri Munda while supporting the public hearing stated that M/s.Thriveni Company will operate its mines in their village. Hence he requested the mine for employment and to look into their various issues.

35. Sri Rabindra Apat, Laserda, Odisha

Sri Apat while supporting the public hearing expressed that M/s. Thriveni Earthmovers company will be opening its mine in their Laserda village. Definitely the unemployment, medical and education problem will be solved after opening of the mines. Further, he told that there is a great problem of communication like road in their Laserda village due to which the villagers are even unable to bring the patients to the hospital for treatment in time, hence requested the company to construct the road. Further he raised the issue of their one of the old Sankirtan Samaj and requested the company to construct a roof for their day to day activity related to Sankirtan Samaj.

36. Sri Sunil Munda, Bolani Basti, Odisha

Sri Munda while supporting the public hearing raised his issue that whenever they approach the Local Sarpanch for employment, the Sarpanch demands money from them and also instructed them to go and approach other Company like Arya Steel and SAIL for employment. In his view, he said why should they approach other companies instead of M/s. Thriveni who will operate in their village. Since in their village, there is no facility of drinking water, Electricity and Medical, he requested the company to provide the same.

37. Smt. Gouri Khuntia, Balagoda Sarpanch, Balagoda, Odisha

Smt. Khuntia while supporting the public hearing stated that after opening of the mines by M/s. Thriveni Company, various problems being faced by the villagers will be solved. She also requested for facilities like good education, medical, drinking water and employment to local

villagers. Further she told that whatever commitment will be agreed upon by M/s.Thriveni Company should be complied positively.

38. Smt. Parbati Naik, PS Member, Bolani G.P, Odisha

Smt. Parbati while supporting the public hearing demanded for employment of the local youths and old age pension (Bhatta) to be given to the old villagers who have no income source. Further, she requested for repairing/construction of roads.

39. Smt. Dolly Das, Kiriburu Hilltop, Odisha

Smt. Das while supporting the public hearing requested the Company to provide employment to the residents of Kiriburu Hill Top area and priority should be given to ladies.

40. Sri Japani Chandra Naik, Bolani Basti, Odisha

Sri Naik while welcoming M/s. Thriveni Eartmovers (P) Ltd and supporting the public hearing told that most of the people of their area belongs to Schedule Caste and Schedule Tribe and unemployment problem is there, hence he requested for employment to them.

41. Sri Rama Chandra Behera, Base Camp, Harmath, Odisha

Sri Behera while supporting the public hearing demanded for development of a play ground in their area.

42. Sri Jagannath Apat, Laserda, Odisha

Sri Apat while supporting the public hearing said she is hopeful that with the operation of mine, employment problem will be resolved and other developmental jobs will also be done by the Company.

43. Sri Bipin Barik, Dhanurjayspur, Odisha

Sri Barik supported the public hearing.

44. Sri Biswanath Barik, Laserda, Odisha

Sri Biswanth supported the public hearing.

45. Sri Gagan Barik, Dhanurjayspur, Harmath, Odisha

Si Barik while supporting the public hearing expressed that all issued raised by the speakers should be complied by the Company. It should not be suppressed under pen and paper.




Sri Naresh supported the public hearing.

So, he demanded the following:-

- i) Employment to local people as per their qualification and outsiders should not be given employment.
- ii) Monetary help to old age persons who are unable to earn.
- iii) 40% of the profit of the company should be spent for the affected villagers.
- iv) Repairing of roads, supply of drinking water, construction of market complex, provision of tube well, bus for students etc.

54. Sri Deepak Khillar, Harmath, Odisha

Sri Khilar supported the public hearing.

55. Sri Rabi Narayan Das, Kiriburu Hilltop, Odisha

Sri Das supported the public hearing.

56. Sri Gauranga Sethi, Dhanurjajpur, Odisha

Sri Sethi supported the public hearing.

57. Smt. Puni Munda, Harmath, Odisha

Sri Munda while supporting the public hearing raised her concern that the local Sarpanch is not responding their request and not doing any developmental jobs in their villages. There is no

facility of drinking water in their villages. So, she requested the company to provide drinking water in their villages.

58. Smt. Naik, Kanarda, Odisha

Smt. Naik while supporting the public hearing raised her concern that though she is a local villager, she was not allowed to enter the public hearing place. She forcefully came inside to speak. She requested the company that they should not be ignored by the company in future and requested for employment and all types of developmental jobs in this area.

59. Sri Sanjay Kumar Khilar, Harmath, Odisha

Sri Khilar while supporting the public hearing stated that employment should be given to the local youths and all necessary steps to be taken for the development of the villages.

60. Smt. Sunia Munda, Laserda, Odisha

Smt. Munda supported the public hearing.

61. Sri Sudan Munda, Dumjurta, Ward No-17, Bolani G.P, Odisha

Sri Sudan while supporting the public hearing requested to supply drinking water, construction of roads, providing light and employment to the local villagers.

62. Sri Gobind Munda, Laserda, Odisha

Sri Munda while supporting the public hearing expressed that employment should be given to the local youths.

63. Sri Raghunath Mukherjee, Harmath Base Camp, Odisha

Sri Mukherjee while supporting the public hearing requested the Company to extend necessary help for maintenance of the Temple and provide drinking water facility in the temple, provide dari/asan for sitting arrangement of children.

64. Sri Pardeshi Munda, Gadadharpur, Bolani G.P, Odisha


Sri Munda supported the public hearing.

65. Sri Maheshwar Munda, Kanarda, Odisha

Sri Maheswar raised his concern that their land will be affected due to mining activities by the Company for which compensatory loss should be taken care of by the company. The Zilla Parishad and Sarpanch have not taken any steps for the development of their area. Hence, he told that if all of their demands will be fulfilled by the company, then only they will support the public hearing.

66. Sri Gamia Munda, Barjan, Bolani G.P, Odisha

Sri Munda while supporting the public hearing told that there should not be any middle man while approaching for their day to day issues with the Company and no bribe or donation should be demanded from them because they are losing their landed property for the operation of mines.



67. Sri Kartik Mukhi, Kiriburu Hilltop, Odisha

Sri Mukhi supported the public hearing.

68. Smt. Laxminder Kaur, Naib Sarpanch, Balagoda, Odisha

Smt. Kaur supported the public hearing.

70. Sri Ishwar Chandra Naik, Kanarda, Odisha

Sri Naik told that if all their demands will be fulfilled than he has no objection in supporting the public hearing.

71. Sri Sahadev Behera, International Human Rights Member, Koida, Odisha

Sri Behera while supporting the public hearing, spoke about the Bana Mahastav and Article-33. He demanded the following :-

- i) Five numbers of Plants to be distributed to each family of their area for plantation in their land.
- ii) Since their area is a cultivated area, Company should provide one tractor, seeds and pesticides for their farming purpose.
- iii) One AC Ambulance should be provided for use by the patients.
- iv) One Gym Centre to be provided
- v) Requested M/s.Thriveni Earthmovers to implement 8 hrs Duty instead of 12 hrs. Duty.
- vi) Providing employment to the local youths
- vii) Security and parking arrangement for transporting of ore for traffic control.

The Regional Officer, SPCB, Keonjhar read over the issues raised by the public in the hearing. Sri Pralayananda Behera, Sr. General Manager of the mine responded to the issues raised. Sri Jadumani Mahala OAS(S), ADM (Revenue) Keonjhar gave concluding remarks of the Hearing.

The issues raised by the public and corresponding comments of the applicant were prepared in Odia and English and it is annexed with the proceedings as Annexure I & II respectively, list of the oral deliberators and participants in the hearing is annexed as Annexure III & IV respectively. Seven numbers of written representations received during public hearing is annexed as Annexure-V (a to g). The video-graph of proceedings are recorded and submitted in pen drive (I).






