

**PROCEEDINGS OF THE PUBLIC HEARING MEETING OF M/S NATIONAL ALUMINIUM COMPANY LIMITED FOR EXPANSION OF ALUMINIUM SMELTER PLANT PRODUCTION CAPACITY FROM 4.6 LTPA TO 9.57 LTPA AT GOPINATHPUR, KANGULA AND KULAD VILLAGES OF ANGUL DISTRICT HELD ON 18.02.2026 AT:10.00 A.M. AT THE HOLDING NO.296, PLOT NO.406, KISSAM-GOCHAR OF VILLAGE GOPINATHPUR UNDER ANGUL TAHASIL OF ANGUL DISTRICT.**

Sri Udaya Kumar Mohapatra, OAS (SAG), Additional District Magistrate (Revenue), Angul presided over the meeting along with Er. Ramesh Kumar Ekka, Regional Officer, State Pollution Control Board, Angul, Odisha.

At the outset, Regional Officer welcomed the public present in the meeting. He briefly described the objective of the public hearing meeting conducted as per the provisions of EIA Notification No. S.O. 1533(E) of Dt.14<sup>th</sup> September 2006 of the Ministry of Environment and Forest & Climate Change (MOEF & CC), Government of India. He also informed that the date, time and venue for conducting the public hearing meeting for M/s National Aluminium Company Limited for expansion of Aluminium Smelter Plant production capacity from 4.6 LTPA to 9.57 LTPA at Gopinathpur, Kangula and Kulad villages of Angul District was scheduled to be held on 18.02.2026 at 10.00 AM on at the holding No.296, Plot No.406, Kissam – Gochar of village Gopinathpur under Angul Tahasil of Angul District was duly advertised in Odia daily "**The Prameya**", dtd. 01.02.2026 and English daily "**The Sunday Express**" dtd.01.02.2026 (Paper clipping are enclosed as **Annexure-I**).

The Addl. District Magistrate has also briefed about the proposed expansion of Aluminium Smelter Plant production capacity from 4.6 LTPA to 9.57 LTPA of M/s. NALCO and requested the public who were present during the public hearing meeting to express their opinion and views on the proposed project. He also requested the representative of the project to highlight about their proposed project before the public.

On behalf of the project proponent, Sri Sachidananda Jena, Executive Director of M/s. National Aluminium Company Limited, Angul has welcomed all the officials and public present over the meeting and delivered briefly about existing company as well as about the proposed project and stated that after establishment of NALCO Smelter and CPP complex started operation on the year 1987. In last 40 years, NALCO smelter plant has achieved production capacity of 4,60,000 T, Aluminium industrial sector is considered as important entity for the Indian economy because aluminum has various applications such as in engineering, construction, electrical sector, health sector, packaging, used in household etc. Due to its softness, light weight, non-toxic nature and 99% recyclable; Aluminium application has been increased constantly and hence, Aluminium is considered as future metal. NALCO has already embarked for brown field expansion of their Alumina plant at Damonjodi and Now NALCO smelter is proposing for Brownfield expansion of Aluminium smelter capacity from 4.6 LTPA to 9.57 LTPA. For this project, the Govt. of Odisha has permission for land acquisition of 137.21 acres of additional area as per requirement of expansion project. As

per, Govt. of India, RFCTLARR Act, 2013 presently land acquisition process is going on NALCO has entrusted M/s Engineers India Limited (EIL) to carry out Environment Impact Assessment Study and preparation of Environmental Management Plan for various environmental components of the proposed expansion of project. Further, he informed about impact of air pollution, water pollution and noise pollution and its proposed mitigation measures. In case of air pollution, dust will be generated from earth-moving, grading and civil works, and movement of vehicles on unpaved roads and PM, CO, NOx, & SO<sub>2</sub> will be generated from operation of diesel sets and diesel engines of machineries and vehicles during construction phase and mitigation measures to be adopted during construction and operation phase to control air pollution such as Ensuring preventive maintenance of vehicles and equipment. Implementing dust control activities such as water sprinkling on unpaved sites, Controlled vehicle speed on site, Developing greenbelt in the proposed new premises, Regular monitoring of air polluting concentrations, Continuous monitoring of air and fugitive emissions, Installation of dry scrubbers to control the fluoride emission from Pot Room & Bake Oven, Installation of bag filters to limit the SPM concentrations to below 100mg/Nm<sup>3</sup>, Controlled firing in ABF to optimize the energy usage and to reduce PAH and NOX emissions, Provision of stacks with adequate height for wider dispersion of gaseous emissions, online measurement and monitoring of emissions (fluoride, particulate matter & PAH) from stacks and Complete hood coverage of cell and highly efficient gas collection system to achieve the minimum emission. In case of water pollution, the effluent streams that will be generated regularly during construction stage such as Sewage and grey water from work sites and Cleaning and washing water for vehicle and equipment maintenance area, hence mitigation measures to control water pollution during construction and operation phase such as Monitoring water usage at work sites to prevent wastage. Proposed ETP/STP plant shall recycle the treated effluent to achieve zero discharge from the process units and the treated sewage shall be recycled routed to new RO/ DE fluoridation Plant. In case of Noise pollution; Noise will be generated during construction and operation phase such as due to operation of heavy equipment and machinery, movement of heavy vehicles in site preparation and civil works, due to various rotating equipment viz. blowers Fans, Crushers, ball mill etc., hence the mitigation measures to be adopted to control noise pollution such as Ensuring preventive maintenance of equipment and vehicles, Ensuring DG sets are provided with acoustic enclosures and exhaust mufflers, Avoiding continuous (more than 8 hrs) exposure of workers to high noise areas, Provision of ear muffs at the high noise areas and Ensuring preventive maintenance of equipment. In case of Land pollution, during construction and operation phase following land pollutions will be occurred such as Solid waste generated during the construction period shall be of low quantity as the scrapes and reusable materials are sold out and other waste are disposed of suitably and also generation of hazardous solid waste from proposed process/treatment units; hence in order to control land pollution following measures will be adopted such as Ensuring any material resulting from clearing and grading should not be deposited on approach roads, streams or ditches, which may hinder the passage and/or natural water drainage, Developing project specific waste management plan

and hazardous material handling plan for the construction phase and the solid waste that is produced during operation phase will be sent to TSDF/authorized recyclers. In order to protect Biological environment; following measures will be taken such as the wastes produced during operation are proposed to be disposed in an environmentally safe manner, without leading to surface water or ground water contamination, and is not expected to cause any harm to the flora and fauna, Development of the further greenbelt as identified areas and Planting of additional trees during operation phase in the surrounding areas of smelter as suggested by Forest Department. He further informed that, socio-economic environment and CSR activities will be benefitted local villages, also this project will bring employment opportunity for local villages and enhance economic development of Angul district, state and country. The NALCO is making one policy for the permanent employment opportunity to skilled and unskilled land loser of affected village in consultation with district administration as per Odisha R & R Policy/act and in addition to that employment opportunity to local land loser will be given on priority basis as per skilled and unskilled qualification. He also informed that for the FY 2025-26, NALCO has proposed to utilize 25 crores of CSR funds for the developmental activities of peripheral villages of NALCO in various sectors such as education, health, road development, water supply etc. of the local peripheral villages and local youths will be engaged for skill development for vocational training. At last, he stated that adequate pollution control measures and preventive measures will be adopted to maintain the range of various pollutants within the permissible limits. Regular monitoring of all the components of environment will be done. Increased social welfare measures will be taken by the company that will bring development and progress in the nearby villages.

Regional Officer invited the public to keep their views on environmental related issues for the proposed project and also requested the public to register their names before delivering their views, opinions and suggestion about the proposed project.

About 350-400 participants have attended the public hearing meeting and out of them 119 participants have put their signature in the attendance sheet whose list is annexed as **Annexure-II**. During meeting, 31 persons have registered their names and delivered their views. List is annexed as **Annexure-III**.

Statements of the public participated in the deliberation during public hearing meeting is as follows;

Sl. No.	Name of the participants and their deliberation.
1.	<p><b><u>Sri Munna Khillar, Gopinathpur :</u></b>            He expressed his dissatisfaction over the proposed project and stated that NALCO had previously given assurance to carry out developmental work for the periphery villages but failed to do so. He informed that company has categorized the Gopinathpur village as No. 1 village for carrying out developmental work, but not yet</p>

	made any road connectivity, no school, no health care facility, no electrification, no light system for the Gopinathpur village.
2.	<b>Smt. Susama Rath, Bentapur :</b> She informed that since 1982, NALCO has acquired their land but no employment opportunity has been given to the land losers. Finally, she demanded to provide an employment opportunity to the local people as per their educational qualification to all even if matric (10 <sup>th</sup> ) fail candidates of the villages in the proposed project.
3.	<b>Sri Chandan Kumar Moharana :</b> He expressed his dissatisfaction and stated that company has adopted pollution control measures and waste management inside industry area only but not for the surrounding affected villages. The industry has not done any developmental work under CSR activities for the peripheral affected villages such as horticultural work and plantation activities etc. He also alleged there is leakage of fluoride gas from the industry, no sprinkling over ash pond, no waste management done by the company. At last, he demanded before the company authority to include education and medical facility and other requirement under CSR activities for the surrounding affected village, permanent employment opportunity as per educational qualification.
4.	<b>Sri Suratha Behera, Kulad :</b> He has demanded to provide permanent employment opportunity and actual compensation to the land losers of the affected village and also warned that otherwise they will not provide land for the expansion project.
5.	<b>Sri Kabindra Dehury, Gadarkhai :</b> He has demanded to provide permanent employment opportunity to the land losers on priority basis of the affected villages. He also suggested to make chamber consisting of Govt., land losers and company so that every year meeting should be carried out through which grievances of the affected villagers, farmers can be resolved through this committee.
6.	<b>Sri Brahmananda Jena, Gopinathpur :</b> He has demanded to provide permanent employment opportunity as per educational qualification and actual compensation to the land losers.
7.	<b>Sri Pratap Nath, Kangula :</b> He has demanded to provide permanent employment opportunity in the company, electricity supply, drinking water supply, school bus and street light systems on roads for the local villages.
8.	<b>Sri Bichitrananda Bhoi, Kangula :</b> He has demanded to provide exact value of land, permanent employment opportunity, developmental activities in the periphery villages, construction of roads, provide electricity light system for the village and resolve the Chakabandi land issues of the local farmers.

9.	<p><b><u>Sri Tapas Kumar Pal, Bentapur :</u></b></p> <p>He has demanded to provide permanent employment opportunity to the land losers of the affected village and surrounding villages, development of the peripheral village, include Badibahal village as peripheral village, separate road construction for affected village and resolves Chaka land issues of the local farmers.</p>
10.	<p><b><u>Sri Pradip Chandra Tripathy, Nuasahi :</u></b></p> <p>He has informed that as per Govt. of India, ISO 14001, many guidelines have been provided for Environmental Pollution, environment department should ensure the installation of ESP and Bag filter at furnace for control of air pollution and water filtration before discharge to outside. He requested to provide present Air Quality Index (AQI). He also alleged that those vehicles do not have pollution certificate giving fine to Govt. and asked NALCO is operating for past 40 years, whether NALCO has given any fine to the Govt. He also suggested that for the success of the project there is need of coordination between land loser, NALCO management and Govt.</p>
11.	<p><b><u>Sri Lalit Pal, Bentapur :</u></b></p> <p>He expressed his dissatisfaction and informed that NALCO has been established since last 40 years and requested before the company authority to provide detail steps taken by NALCO for protection of environment and control of pollution in the surrounding area. He alleged about the damaged condition of the roads in the Bentapur village and informed that NALCO has not constructed a road for the Bentapur village, in our village there is no livestock's available because of the fluoride released from the NALCO, also alleged that NALCO has not done any plantation activities around the boundary area of NALCO to control Pollution because plantation is one of the medium to control pollution in the surrounding area.</p>
12.	<p><b><u>Smt Lipika Jena, Gopinathpur :</u></b></p> <p>She has demanded to provide exact value of land-to-land losers, permanent employment opportunity to villagers even if metric fail individual must get engagement in the company. Finally, she warned that the land will not be provided to the company for the proposed expansion project if their demands are not fulfilled.</p>
13.	<p><b><u>Smt Uma Jena, Gopinathpur :</u></b></p> <p>She has demanded to provide employment opportunity to the land losers, otherwise they will not provide land to the company.</p>
14.	<p><b><u>Sri Dibasa Pradhan, Ankula :</u></b></p> <p>He has informed that my land is going to be acquired for the expansion of the project, so please ensure my benefits as a land loser.</p>
15.	<p><b><u>Sri Dushmant Dehury, Gadarakhai :</u></b></p> <p>He has informed that NALCO has been established since last 46 years ago and also said that his village is situated at East side of the NALCO and hence their livestock's as well as human beings are being affected due to pollution of NALCO plant. He also concerned about the fluoride discharge from the company which has affected</p>

	<p>the agricultural land. Further, he alleged that company has not supplied any drinking water to the local villages and also no road construction has been done. Finally, he expressed his dissatisfaction towards company and said that if their demands are not fulfilled then they will not allow for the operation of more aluminium smelter pot line units as it drastically polluting the surrounding environment.</p>
16.	<p><b><u>Sri Manoranjan Tripathy, Bentapur :</u></b>  He has informed that Angul is considered as polluted area and NALCO is also polluting the surrounding environment. He has demanded to provide 70% permanent employment opportunity to the individuals local villagers, construction of 20 ft concrete road from NALCO township to Bentapur Santosh Parida's house, light system for the village, drainage system as per requirement, provide cycle stand and aqua guard for the school, provide Gochar land to villagers for the livestock's, demanded to provide provision one police out-post, exact value of land, educational qualification based employment opportunity to the land losers, otherwise strike's will be carried out against the NALCO.</p>
17.	<p><b><u>Sri Manoj Kumar Mohapatra, Social Worker, Boinda :</u></b>  He appealed before the authority to provide details regarding any standard criterial for release of toxic gases to the surroundings and put a questioned before the authority whether any monitoring is being carried out or not and whether expansion of NALCO project will affect the local environment and further asked to provide any action plan for unusual incidents like release of toxic gases, fire incidents, chemical leakage etc.</p>
18.	<p><b><u>Sri Arun Kumar Jena, Ankula :</u></b>  He introduce himself as physically Handicapped person in his family and stated that there are four such Physically handicapped individuals are carrying out farming activities in their land for their livelihood which lands shall be acquired by NALCO authority for the expansion project. Finally, he demanded before the company authority to provide permanent employment opportunity in the proposed project.</p>
19.	<p><b><u>Sri Dibya Santanu Nath, Gopinathpur, Media person :</u></b>  He has stated that Angul is considered as polluted city and in last December month Highest AQI was 346, whereas in the month of January, there were 12 no. days under red category level as per Sameer APP and in month of February 3 and 4 the AQI was 307 and 316 respectively, so pollution is increasing and company is also operating vice-versa. He has asked to provide details pollution control measures to be adopted by the industry in order to control pollution during expansion project. He also pointed out that, page no. 9 of the executive summary mentioned about man power requirement about 850 no. (Executives 170 nos. and non-executives 680 nos.) of employees and temporary/contractual requirement man power is around 1500 nos., so he hopes that if proposed employment will be given to affected villagers, then company will grow and villagers will be benefitted from this.</p>

20.	<p><b><u>Sri Prakash Bhoi, Bentapur :</u></b>  He has demanded to construct a hospital for the local affected villages, permanent employment opportunity for all the individuals of the land losers and also employment opportunity to non-land losers as they are going to affect from the pollution.</p>
21.	<p><b><u>Sri Biplab Jena, Kulad :</u></b>  He has informed that 39 no. of peripheral village is affected from the NALCO plant and NALCO has not carried out any plantation activities in the peripheral villages to control pollution within its limits. He also alleged that 1000 acres of land is affected due to water pollution and from the ash pond due to blowing of ash. He also welcomed the project and demanded to control pollution in affected peripheral village.</p>
22.	<p><b><u>Sri Arun Kumar Pradhan, Gopinathpur :</u></b>  He has informed that developed green belt at Padmapada thakur going to be affected, hence requested to restoration of land Kadamba thakur. He alleged that due to fluoride discharge from NALCO has affected nearby village ponds, tubewells and wells etc., where fluoride is found at above standards. So he requested to take steps to control the release of fluoride gas into the environment. He also requested to provide drinking water supply to the Gopinathpur village.</p>
23.	<p><b><u>Sri Santosh Kumar Mishra, Prameya News :</u></b>  He demanded before the NALCO authority to provide details about the developmental activities going to be undertaken under CSR activities and also asked whether more funds will be utilised under CSR activities for the development of peripheral villages.</p>
24.	<p><b><u>Sri Tapan Kumar Das, Argus News :</u></b>  He has asked to provide the details of control measures for the release fluoride gas, chemical substances due to expansion project and also asked during brownfield expansion project, what are the measures will be taken for the peripheral area.</p>
25.	<p><b><u>Sri Bhikari Mohanty, News 18, Journalist :</u></b>  He appealed before the authority to provide details of employment, types of employment and criteria of employment and also provide details about all round developmental activities such as health, education sectors etc. for the peripheral affected village and Angul district.</p>
26.	<p><b><u>Sri Sipun Pradhan, Gopinathpur :</u></b>  He has informed that NALCO will acquire land from us and in return we will get toxic gases, polluted water for the expansion project. So, he demanded to provide permanent employment opportunity to the family of land losers and engagement of local unemployed youths in the maintenance of NALCO and also hospital for the affected villages, and free medicine facility to every individual of the affected village and he also urged provide the assurance of facility in written.</p>

27.	<p><b><u>Sri Sangram Ranjan Nath, Angul :</u></b>  He delivered his statement and asked before the NALCO authority to provide action plan to maintain green belt development and also informed that many times toxic gases such as fluoride and carbon is also releasing from the industry which is also affecting nearby surrounding villages and Angul is considered as polluted area. so NALCO must clarify what action will be taken by NALCO authority for the control of carbon and fluoride gas release due to expansion project.</p>
28.	<p><b><u>Sri Ramesh Chandra Bhukta, Kangula :</u></b>  He stated that no demands of the villagers is being fulfilled by NALCO for the villagers, during the year 2012 villagers have demanded to construct one bridge, but industry did not respond to the villagers. He also informed that fluoride gas is being discharged and waste is being discharged by industry which is spreading towards 3 KM surrounding village of the industry. So he demanded to look into the matter, otherwise local villagers will protest against the industry.</p>
29.	<p><b><u>Sri Nihar Ranjan Pattnayak, Kurudol :</u></b>  He stated that only outdoor patient health care facility has been provided by NALCO which is not sufficient for entire village and also provided one no. of mobile health care facility is not sufficient and not coming regularly and asked before the NALCO that; did any officer has examined the movement of vehicle and medical facilities provided to the villagers. He further, alleged that ash pond is open and no sprinkling is being carried out by industry over ash pond which creates fugitive emission due to wind blowing to the surrounding villages. No plantation activities have been carried out by NALCO. He requested to make one action plan for the labours and employees of NALCO facing any accident or death inside the factory and outside factory premises for easy access of the facility to the victims.</p>
30.	<p><b><u>Sri Narayan Behera, Badibahal :</u></b>  He stated that Badibahal village is around 100 meter from the boundary of the NALCO and villagers are also directly or indirectly affected due to the NALCO, so he requested before the NALCO authority to list out Badibahal as peripheral village in the current expansion project and also requested to include the Badibahal village under TADA. He also informed that they have submitted their grievance on 2022, but no action has been taken and no CSR fund has been utilised for the Badibahal village. So requested look after the public grievance and also list the Badibahal village as peripheral village and also under TADA.</p>
31.	<p><b><u>Sri Bibhuti Bhusan Tripathy, Nuasahi :</u></b>  He stated that previously land had been acquired by NALCO from the land owners but the industry has not created any employment opportunity for the land looser because either there is gap in land acquisition policy of Govt. and lacking of participation from of every individual from the local villages as per rule &amp; regulation made by NALCO in consultation with district administration. He also pointed out that in the present situation of expansion, there is increase in pollution, AQI, fluoride</p>

contamination by NALCO smelter which affects surrounding village. At last, he has demanded before the NALCO authority and district administration that every land looser belongs to land RoR must be provided with permanent employment opportunity as per the educational qualification in the NALCO, school development, community development, construction of roads, light facility for villages, renovation and rejuvenation of village ponds, provision for admission of local village students in the schools of NALCO must be fulfilled, after that land acquisition may be carried for the project.

Summary of the points raised by the participants in the public hearing are being briefed by Regional Officer and same in English and Odia (vernacular language) is enclosed as **Annexure-IV (A & B)**.

After the completion of the deliberation process the Regional Officer invited the representatives of proposed project to give a brief note on the issues related to the demand and grievances of the participants raised in the public hearing meeting.

On behalf of the project proponent, Sri Narayan Rath, GM (Environment) and Rajarama Mishra GM (Adm.), M/s. NALCO has responded on the issues raised by the participants during public hearing and the same in English and Odia (vernacular language) are also given as **Annexure-V (A & B)**. The video recording of the entire proceeding of the public hearing meeting is enclosed as Compact Disc (CD). During public hearing, 07 nos. of written applications were received which are enclosed as **Annexure-VI** (Sl. No. 01-07).

**1. Application received from Sri Santosh Kumar Sahu and others, Gopinathpur Village Committee:**

They have alleged around 44 Acres of land belongs to Gochar Kissam is converting into Patita Kissam without any regulation for the land acquisition of NALCO and also release of fluoride gas led to loss of livestock's of Gopinathpur village and also affected local villagers and hence demanded for health care facility, road construction, drainage facility, modern electricity supply, green belt development inside the village, education facility, construction of Bhagabat Tungi and Kalyan mandap, renovation of village ponds, all round development of Padmapada Matha at a new site, temple construction, home construction, community Toilet, community health center and provision of employment opportunity as per educational qualification to the land losers.

**2. Application received from Sri Lalit Pal and Others, Bentpur Village Committee:**

They have alleged that NALCO smelter plant is operating for last 40 years and it releases toxic gases which cause fire of rice crop fields, affecting livestocks, also causes many losses to local public even death of local individuals from the village. So they have demanded to close down the expansion project of NALCO smelter plant.

**3. Application received from Kalyani Bilas and others, Kangula Village Committee:**

They have addressed the application to the Addl. District Magistrate (Revenue), Angul and have alleged that NALCO has not done any developmental activities for Kangula village as

peripheral village, in this connection they have demanded the following, such as development of playground of Kangula village into a Mini Stadium, construction of a bridge after Lingara nallah connecting Kangula main village and Mundia Sahi Kangula for public movement, installation of light system for every street of the 6 no. of wards of Kangula village, provide cold drinking water facility to every ward of Kangula village, concreting of road and drainage system of every ward, development of Siva Temple along with construction of boundary around the temple; installation of paver blocks and light system for the temple, construction of concrete steps at Lingara nallah for toilet purpose of the local village individuals and also provision of light sytem, provide funds for the construction of community center for women in 6 no. of wards, cold drinking water facility for 4 no. of schools of 6 no. of wards of Knagula village, construction of additional classrooms, provision of E-library, computer education for all the schools of Kangula village, for better health care facility, provide one doctor with medicine providing vehicle for individual wards of the village, Maa Kali temple development and light system of the temple and provision of employment opportunity for unemployed local youths (male & female) on contractual basis.

**4. Application received from Bibhuti Bhusan Tripathy and Dhableswar Tripathy, Nuasahi Village Committee, Angul**

They have alleged that, they are affected due to pollution from the NALCO Smelter and Captive Power plant, fluoride gas released from smelter plant affects crop fields, many people are affected with various diseases due to air pollution, also apprehended that pollution will be increased after the expansion project, so requested to take remedy action and fulfill the demands of villagers, demanded to provide permanent employment opportunity to one individual of the every land looser family of the land as per educational qualification, they also demanded fulfillment of community village work such as renovation of chatimunda pond, construction of a Kalyan mandap and one community hall, construction of 2nd floor for the village club house, construction of road from village to NH-Bye pass, free medical checkup and facility for villagers, admission of village children in the NALCO school, and make equal land rate of Gopinathpur and Kangula acquired land with Kulad village land, also demanded to provide employment opportunity to non-land losers of the village on contract basis.

**5. Application received from Lalit Pal and others, Bentpur Village Committee, Angul:**

Application has been addressed to the Collector, Angul and demanded the following such as permanent employment opportunity in the NALCO and money to the land losers, also provide Gochar land to the Bentpur village against the proposed acquired Gochar land, before acquiring road connecting to Bentpur- NALCO police station; construct alternate road such as 20 ft. concrete road along with light system from Santosh Parida House of Bentpur village to NALCO police station, and construction of drainage and boundary wall and plantation activities; construction of boundary wall and cycle stand for Panchayat U.P. School and Nodal U.P. **7. Application received from Paratp Kumar Nath and others, land Loser and village Committee, Kulad- Kangula-Gopinathpur Mouza, Angul:**

They have demanded the following such as:


- Provision of permanent/regular employment opportunity to all individual of the land loser family as per educational qualification (Matric pass and above) as technical and non-technical category in the NALCO.
- Provide compensation for land, home, tube well and other associated assets of land loser and also provide compensation as per highest benchmark of land value of Kulad and publish a notice for the village for the highest benchmark value of land.
- For every employment, highest age limit should be till 45 years.

The NALCO has installed CAAQMS station for the ambient air quality data and data is being displayed on display for public view.
2. The project proponent has assured that advanced technology will be adopted for control of air, water, noise and dust pollution for the expansion project.
3. The project proponent has assured to carry out massive plantation activities in and around plant premises and peripheral villages.
4. The project proponent has assured to provide an employment opportunity as per the Government norms.




